# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

 $\mathbf{2}$ Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - License Expiration 3 PG 308-09 4 FOR the purpose of establishing that in Prince George's County an alcoholic beverages 5 license expires on a certain date after the licensee has closed the business or 6 ceased active alcoholic beverages business operations; providing for exceptions 7to certain expiration provisions; specifying certain conditions under which a written request for a license extension due to undue hardship may be filed with 8 9 the Board of License Commissioners; authorizing the Board under certain 10 circumstances to grant an extension not exceeding a certain period; specifying that the total period for which a license may be considered unexpired may not 11 exceed a certain number of days; specifying events marking the beginning and 12 13suspending of the total period for unexpired licenses; defining a certain term; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Prince George's County. 14 15BY adding to 16 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages 17Section 10–504(i) Annotated Code of Maryland 18 19 (2005 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement) 20SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 22Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages 2310-504.24THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN PRINCE GEORGE'S **(I)** (1) 25COUNTY.

IN THIS SUBSECTION, "BOARD" MEANS THE BOARD OF 1 (2)  $\mathbf{2}$ LICENSE COMMISSIONERS OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY. 3 (3) IT IS THE INTENT OF THIS SUBSECTION THAT THE TOTAL 4 PERIOD FOR WHICH A LICENSE MAY BE CONSIDERED UNEXPIRED IS:  $\mathbf{5}$ **(I)** SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, 180 6 DAYS IF AN UNDUE HARDSHIP EXTENSION IS NOT GRANTED; AND  $\mathbf{7}$ (II) NOT MORE THAN 360 DAYS IF AN UNDUE HARDSHIP 8 **EXTENSION IS GRANTED.** 9 (4) A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL EXPIRE 180 10 DAYS AFTER THE HOLDER OF A LICENSE HAS CLOSED THE BUSINESS OR CEASED 11 ACTIVE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BUSINESS OPERATIONS OF THE BUSINESS FOR 12WHICH THE LICENSE IS HELD, UNLESS: 13 **(I)** AN APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF A TRANSFER TO 14 ANOTHER LOCATION OR AN APPLICATION FOR ASSIGNMENT TO ANOTHER 15PERSON UNDER § 10-503(R) OF THIS SUBTITLE HAS BEEN APPROVED OR IS 16 **PENDING:** 17 (II) AN APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE UNDER § 10–506(B) OF 18 THIS SUBTITLE AFTER THE DEATH OF A HOLDER OF A LICENSE HAS BEEN 19 **APPROVED OR IS PENDING; OR** 20 (III) A WRITTEN REQUEST FOR AN UNDUE HARDSHIP 21EXTENSION, AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IS FILED 22WITHIN THE 180-DAY PERIOD. 23(5) **(I)** THE HOLDER OF A LICENSE OR OTHER APPROPRIATE 24INTERESTED PARTY MAY MAKE A WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE BOARD FOR AN 25UNDUE HARDSHIP EXTENSION OF THE LIFE OF THE LICENSE. 26 (II) IF THE BOARD FINDS AFTER A HEARING THAT UNDUE 27HARDSHIP EXISTS, CAUSING THE CLOSING OR CESSATION OF BUSINESS 28OPERATIONS, THE BOARD MAY GRANT AN EXTENSION SO THAT THE LICENSE 29 REMAINS UNEXPIRED FOR NOT MORE THAN 360 DAYS, SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH 30 (6) OF THIS SUBSECTION. 31(6) THE TOTAL PERIOD FOR WHICH A LICENSE MAY BE

32 CONSIDERED UNEXPIRED:

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1(I) BEGINS AT THE EARLIER OF THE CLOSING OF THE2BUSINESS OR CESSATION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BUSINESS;

3 (II) MAY BE SUSPENDED ONLY ON THE FILING OF AN 4 APPLICATION OR REQUEST DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS 5 SUBSECTION; AND

6 (III) SHALL BEGIN RUNNING AGAIN, CUMULATIVELY TO THE 7 TIME PERIOD BEFORE THE FILING OF THE APPLICATION OR REQUEST, ON THE 8 OCCURRENCE OF THE LATER OF THE FOLLOWING EVENTS:

9 1. FINAL ACTION OF THE BOARD GRANTING OR 10 DENYING A REQUEST AUTHORIZED BY PARAGRAPH (4)(III) OF THIS 11 SUBSECTION;

122.FINAL ACTION OF THE BOARD DENYING AN13APPLICATION DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (4)(I) OR (II) OF THIS14SUBSECTION;

153. FINAL JUDGMENT OF THE APPELLATE COURT16WHEN JUDICIAL REVIEW OF THE BOARD'S ACTION ON AN APPLICATION OR17REQUEST AUTHORIZED BY PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION IS SOUGHT; OR

184.DISMISSAL OF A PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW19OF THE BOARD'S ACTION.

20(7)IF AN APPLICATION OR REQUEST UNDER PARAGRAPH (4) OF21THIS SUBSECTION IS WITHDRAWN:

22(I)THE PERIOD FOR EXPIRATION OF THE LICENSE MAY23NOT BE SUSPENDED; AND

24(II)THE APPLICATION OR REQUEST SHALL BE CONSIDERED25AS IF IT HAD NOT BEEN FILED.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 October 1, 2009.
