- FOR the purpose of altering the number of persons required to make a sworn
 complaint in the District Court alleging that a domestic animal disturbs the
 peace and quiet of any neighborhood in an inhabited area of, or is vicious and
 <u>has bitten any person, in</u> Cecil County in order for a summons to be issued to
 the owner or keeper of the animal; altering a certain penalty; making stylistic
 changes; and generally relating to the regulation of domestic animals in Cecil
 County.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 (l) (5) It is unlawful in Cecil County for any person to own or keep a 20 domestic animal which disturbs the peace and quiet of any neighborhood in an 21 inhabited area, or which is vicious and bites any person. Upon the sworn complaint in

1 the District Court sitting in Cecil County of any [two or more persons of different $\mathbf{2}$ households] **PERSON** alleging that a domestic animal disturbs the peace and quiet of 3 any neighborhood in an inhabited area of Cecil County, or upon the sworn complaint of any [one or more persons] **PERSON** that a domestic animal is vicious and has bitten 4 $\mathbf{5}$ any person, a summons shall issue to the owner or keeper of such domestic animal to 6 appear in the District Court sitting in Cecil County. Upon proof that the domestic 7 animal disturbs the peace and quiet of any neighborhood in an inhabited area, or is 8 vicious and has bitten any person, the owner or keeper may be required to deliver up 9 the offending domestic animal to be killed in the most humane manner possible unless he removes the domestic animal permanently from the neighborhood. If the owner or 10 11 keeper is required to deliver up the domestic animal to be killed or to remove it as 12aforesaid, and he refuses or fails to do so, then it is the duty of any police officer or any duly empowered agent on behalf of the county to seize the domestic animal wherever it 1314 may be found and to cause it to be killed in the most humane manner possible. The 15court may order the domestic animal restrained or enter such other appropriate order 16 as the case may require. Any owner failing to comply with the provisions of this 17paragraph or a court order entered thereunder is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon 18 conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not more than [twenty-five dollars 19 (\$25.00)] **\$500** for each offense. Notwithstanding the aforegoing provisions of this 20subsection, the barking of hunting dogs in pursuit of game [shall] MAY not be 21considered a disturbance of the public peace for the purposes hereof.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2009.
