### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Employees' Pension System - Service Retirement Allowance - Creditable 3 Service

- FOR the purpose of providing that certain individuals who were employed by the City
  of Annapolis as contractual employees for a certain period of time may receive a
  certain amount of creditable service in the Employees' Pension System;
  providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to service credit
  in the Employees' Pension System for contractual employees.
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 MARYLAND, That:
- 11 (a) This section applies to any individual who:
- (1) on or after February 1, 2000, was enrolled in the Employees'
  Pension System under Title 23 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article as an
  employee of the City of Annapolis;
- 15 (2) on or after July 1, 2003, began working as a contractual employee
  16 for the City of Annapolis while participating in the Employees' Pension System;
- 17 (3) on or after July 1, 2008, became a permanent employee of the City
   18 of Annapolis; and
- 19 (4) while a member of the Employees' Pension System as a contractual20 employee of the City of Annapolis had:
- (i) member contributions deducted from the individual's annual
   earnable compensation; and

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1 (ii) the City of Annapolis pay employer contributions to the 2 Employees' Pension System on behalf of the individual.

3 (b) An individual described under subsection (a) of this section may receive 4 creditable service in the Employees' Pension System for the period of time the 5 individual was a contractual employee of the City of Annapolis and had employee 6 contributions deducted from the individual's annual earnable compensation.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
July 1, 2009. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of
December 31, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
