#### 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(I) UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF ANOTHER WHO IS AT
 LEAST 21 YEARS OLD AND WHO IS NOT PROHIBITED BY STATE OR FEDERAL LAW
 FROM POSSESSING A FIREARM; OR
