4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	FOR the purpose of providing that if the county councils of Montgomery and Prince George's counties fail to concur in a change in the funding of an item in the capital budget of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) by a certain time, the funding level for that item may not exceed a certain level; providing that if the county councils of Montgomery and Prince George's counties fail to approve the capital budget of the WSSC by a certain time, the funding levels for the capital budgets may not exceed a certain level; and generally relating to the capital budget of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission.

18 19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
20	Article 29 - Washington Suburban Sanitary District

22	(a) The WSSC:
23 24	(1) Before January 15 of each year, shall prepare capital and operating budgets for the next fiscal year, which shall include projects and contracts authorized

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- under §§ 1–206 and 1–208 of this subtitle, which shall be open for inspection by the public and copies shall be made available to the public on request;
- 3 (2) Before February 15 of each year, shall hold a public hearing on the 4 proposed budgets after giving at least 21 days' notice of the hearing by publication in 5 at least 2 newspapers published and generally circulated in Montgomery County and 2 6 newspapers published and generally circulated in Prince George's County;
- 7 (3) On or before March 1 of each year, shall prepare and submit to the 8 County Executives of Montgomery and Prince George's counties, the capital and 9 operating budgets for the WSSC, for the next fiscal year together with the record of 10 any public hearing which was held on the budgets;
- 11 (4) Shall identify the sources of revenue allocable to the various 12 proposed expenditures;
- 13 (5) Shall propose a complete schedule of rates for the water 14 consumption and sewer usage charges and ad valorem tax levies that the WSSC 15 considers necessary to finance the budgets;
- 16 (6) Shall certify the amounts necessary to be raised for the next year for the payment of interest and principal on all outstanding bonds and notes of the WSSC; and
- 19 (7) Between March 1 and April 1 of each year, may submit to the 20 County Executives of Montgomery and Prince George's counties amendatory items to 21 the proposed budgets, together with a declaration of need identifying the sources of 22 revenue allocable to the proposed amendatory items.
- 23 (b) Each County Executive shall transmit to the County Council of the 24 county:
- 25 (1) The proposed budgets, together with recommendations on the 26 proposed budgets, and the record of any public hearing held by the WSSC, not later 27 than March 15 of each year; and
- 28 (2) Amendatory items to the proposed budgets with their 29 recommendations within 10 days after receipt of the amendatory items.
  - (c) (1) Each County Council:
- 31 (i) On public notice, may hold public hearings on the proposed 32 budgets of the WSSC not earlier than 21 calendar days following receipt from the 33 County Executive;
- 34 (ii) May add to, delete from, increase, or decrease an item of 35 either budget, and shall transmit by May 15 any proposed changes to the other County 36 Council for review and concurrence; and

$\frac{1}{2}$	(iii) $$ On or before June 1 of each year, shall approve the budgets and transmit them to the WSSC.
3 4 5 6	(2) (i) <b>1.</b> If the County Councils fail to concur in a change with respect to <b>THE FUNDING OF</b> any item <b>IN THE OPERATING BUDGET OF THE WSSC</b> by June 1, the failure to concur constitutes approval of the item submitted by the WSSC.
7 8 9 10 11	2. IF THE COUNTY COUNCILS FAIL TO CONCUR IN A CHANGE WITH RESPECT TO THE FUNDING OF ANY ITEM IN THE CAPITAL BUDGET OF THE WSSC, THE FUNDING LEVEL FOR THE ITEM MAY NOT EXCEED THE FUNDING LEVEL FOR THE ITEM IN THE CAPITAL BUDGET FOR THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR.
12 13 14	(ii) <b>1.</b> If the County Councils fail to approve the [budgets on or before] <b>OPERATING BUDGET OF THE WSSC BY</b> June 1 of each year, the proposed [budgets] <b>OPERATING BUDGET</b> of the WSSC [are] <b>IS</b> adopted.
15 16 17 18	2. If the County Councils fail to approve the capital budget of the WSSC by June 1 of each year, the funding level for the capital budget may not exceed the funding level for the capital budget for the immediately preceding fiscal year.
19 20 21	(e) (1) The WSSC may submit to the County Executives of the counties proposed supplements to the approved budgets. The submittals shall include full particulars.
22 23 24	(2) Within 10 days of receipt of the proposed supplements, the County Executive of each county shall transmit the proposed supplements to the County Council of that county, together with recommendations.
25	(3) Each County Council:
26	(i) May hold public hearings on the proposed supplements; and
27 28	(ii) May add to, delete from, increase, or decrease the proposed supplements.
29 30 31 32 33	(4) The failure of the County Councils to jointly approve or amend the proposed supplements within 90 days from the date of transmittal of the proposed supplements to the County Executives by the WSSC constitutes disapproval of the supplements by the County Councils of Montgomery and Prince George's counties as submitted by the WSSC.

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- 1 (f) (1) Through joint action, the County Councils may recommend to the WSSC rates for water consumption and sewer usage charges and ad valorem tax levies on transmission of the approved budget of the WSSC.
- 4 (2) On receipt of the budgets and recommendations from the County 5 Councils, the WSSC shall approve a rate schedule taking into consideration the proposed rate changes recommended by the joint action of the Councils.
  - (3) Subject to the provisions of § 6–103 of this article, the rates for sewer and water usage charges shall be uniform throughout the sanitary district.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2009.
