1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Commission for Women - Appointment of Members

3 FOR the purpose of altering the manner by which the members of the Maryland 4 Commission for Women are appointed; requiring the Governor to appoint a 5 certain number of the members of the Commission, subject to the advice and 6 consent of the Senate; requiring the President of the Senate and the Speaker of 7 the House of Delegates each to nominate a certain number of the members of 8 the Commission and to submit those names to the Governor; requiring the 9 Governor to appoint all of the nominees of the President and the Speaker to the 10 Commission; requiring the Governor, the President, and the Speaker to appoint or nominate the members of the Commission in a certain manner; providing 11 12 that certain current members of the Commission who were appointed by the Governor, the President, and the Speaker and whose terms expire in certain 13 years may be renominated and reappointed to one additional consecutive term 14 of office or replaced by new members in accordance with this Act; and generally 15 relating to the appointment of the members of the Maryland Commission for 16 17 Women.

- 1 (1) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT NINE OF THE MEMBERS, 2 SUBJECT TO THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND;
- 3 (2) THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL NOMINATE EIGHT OF 4 THE MEMBERS AND SUBMIT THEIR NAMES TO THE GOVERNOR, WHO SHALL 5 APPOINT ALL EIGHT OF THE PRESIDENT'S NOMINEES TO THE COMMISSION; AND
- 6 (3) THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES SHALL 7 NOMINATE EIGHT OF THE MEMBERS AND SUBMIT THEIR NAMES TO THE 8 GOVERNOR, WHO SHALL APPOINT ALL EIGHT OF THE SPEAKER'S NOMINEES TO 9 THE COMMISSION.

- 22 **(2)** THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED FROM 23 APPLICANTS APPLYING ON THEIR OWN BEHALF:
- 24 (I) FIVE OF THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR;
- 25 (II) FOUR OF THE MEMBERS NOMINATED BY THE 26 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND SUBMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR FOR 27 APPOINTMENT; AND
- 28 (III) FOUR OF THE MEMBERS NOMINATED BY THE SPEAKER
 29 OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES AND SUBMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR FOR

- 31 [(c)] (D) To the extent practicable, in making [appointments] THE 32 NOMINATIONS under this section, the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the

- Speaker of the House **OF DELEGATES** shall ensure geographic diversity among the membership of the Commission.
- 3 [(d)] (E) (1) The term of a commissioner is 4 years.
- 4 (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms 5 provided for members of the Commission on October 1, 2007.
- 6 (3) A commissioner may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
- 7 (4) At the end of a term, a commissioner continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- 9 (5) A commissioner who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- [(e)] **(F)** A commissioner who fails to attend at least 50% of the regularly scheduled meetings of the Commission during any 12-month period shall be considered to have resigned.
- [(f)] (G) Commissioners are not entitled to receive compensation for their services.

- 17 (a) The Commission shall elect a chair and a vice chair from among its 18 members.
- 19 (b) The Commission may appoint any officers that it considers necessary.
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 21 (a) the members of the Maryland Commission for Women who were 22 appointed by the Governor and whose terms end in 2009, 2010, and 2011, respectively, 23 may be:
- 24 (1) reappointed by the Governor, subject to the advice and consent of the Senate, to one additional consecutive term of office; or
- 26 (2) replaced with new members appointed in accordance with the 27 provisions of Section 1 of this Act; and
- 28 (b) the members of the Commission who were appointed by the President of the Senate and the members of the Commission who were appointed by the Speaker of the House, all of whose terms end in 2009, 2010, and 2011, respectively, may be:

- 1 (1) renominated by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 2 House and, if so, the President and the Speaker shall submit their names to the 3 Governor who shall reappoint them to one additional consecutive term of office; or
- 4 (2) replaced with new members nominated and appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 June 1, 2009.
