A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Food and Hunger Policy Council – Department of Agriculture

3 FOR the purpose of creating the Maryland Food and Hunger Policy Council in the Department of Agriculture: providing for the composition and staffing of the 4 Council; providing that a member of the Council may not receive compensation 5 but may be reimbursed for certain expenses; specifying the terms of the initial 6 members of the Council; authorizing the Council to establish certain 7 8 subcommittees and elect certain officers; authorizing the Council to appoint 9 certain nonvoting affiliate members; specifying the duties of the Council; requiring the Council to adopt certain action plans; requiring the Commission to 10 report to the Governor, the Secretary of Agriculture, and the General Assembly 11 on or before certain dates; defining certain terms; specifying the terms of the 12 13 initial members of the Council; and generally relating to the Maryland Food and Hunger Policy Council. 14

3 (B) "COUNCIL" MEANS THE MARYLAND FOOD AND HUNGER POLICY
 4 COUNCIL.

5 (C) "SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE" MEANS AN INTEGRATED SYSTEM OF 6 PLANT AND ANIMAL PRODUCTION PRACTICES HAVING A SITE–SPECIFIC 7 APPLICATION THAT OVER THE LONG TERM WILL:

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(1) SATISFY HUMAN FOOD AND FIBER NEEDS;

9 (2) ENHANCE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY AND THE NATURAL 10 RESOURCE BASE ON WHICH THE AGRICULTURAL ECONOMY DEPENDS;

11(3) MAKE THE MOST EFFICIENT USE OF NONRENEWABLE12RESOURCES AND ON-FARM RESOURCES AND INTEGRATE, WHERE13APPROPRIATE, NATURAL BIOLOGICAL CYCLES AND CONTROLS;

14(4)SUSTAIN THE ECONOMIC VIABILITY OF FARM OPERATIONS;15AND

16(5)ENHANCE THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR FARMERS AND SOCIETY17AS A WHOLE.

20 (B) THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

(1) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY
 THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;

23(2)ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY24THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

25(3)THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE, OR THE SECRETARY'S26DESIGNEE;

27 (4) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, OR THE
 28 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

"PASTURE-RAISED LIVESTOCK"; OR 253. "SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE"; 26 (VII) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A FARMER'S MARKET IN THE 27**STATE: AND** 28(VIII) TWO RESIDENTS OF THE STATE.

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1 (C) (1)THE TERM OF A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL APPOINTED BY $\mathbf{2}$ THE GOVERNOR IS 3 YEARS. 3 (2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY 4 THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL ON JULY 1, 2009. $\mathbf{5}$ AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE (3) 6 UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES. 7 A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN (4) 8 SHALL SERVE FOR THE REST OF THE TERM OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS 9 **APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.** 10 **(D)** THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A SUCCESSOR IN THE EVENT OF A 11 VACANCY ON THE COUNCIL. 12**(E) A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL:** 13 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 14 **COUNCIL; BUT** 15(2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 16 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE 17**BUDGET.** 18 **(F)** A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS THEN SERVING ON THE COUNCIL IS 19 A QUORUM. 20(G) THE COUNCIL MAY ELECT FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS A CHAIR, 21VICE CHAIR, SECRETARY, AND OTHER OFFICERS THE COUNCIL DEEMS 22APPROPRIATE. 23**(H)** THE COUNCIL MAY ESTABLISH SUBCOMMITTEES TO PROVIDE (1) 24TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE COUNCIL. 25(2) THE COUNCIL MAY ESTABLISH SUBCOMMITTEE TOPICS AND 26 MEMBERSHIP AS THE COUNCIL DEEMS APPROPRIATE. 27**(I)** THE COUNCIL MAY APPOINT NONVOTING AFFILIATE MEMBERS TO 28PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE COUNCIL, WITH MEMBERSHIP AS THE 29 **COUNCIL DETERMINES, INCLUDING A REPRESENTATIVE OF:**

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1 (2) **MARYLAND FOOD RETAILERS;** $\mathbf{2}$ (3) **NONFOOD MANUFACTURERS; AND** 3 (4) THE MARYLAND RESTAURANT ASSOCIATION. 4 **(J)** THE COUNCIL SHALL MEET QUARTERLY. $\mathbf{5}$ **(K)** Тне GOVERNOR'S INTERGOVERNMENTAL COMMISSION ON 6 AGRICULTURE SHALL PROVIDE APPROPRIATE STAFF FOR THE COUNCIL. 7 10-1703. 8 (A) IN CONSULTATION WITH APPROPRIATE STATE AGENCIES AND 9 **OTHER INTERESTED ORGANIZATIONS, THE COUNCIL SHALL:** 10 (1) DEVELOP STRATEGIES, INCLUDING LEGISLATIVE AND 11 **REGULATORY INITIATIVES, TO:** 12**(I)** ELIMINATE HUNGER IN THE STATE FOR MARYLAND'S 13 CHILDREN; 14 **CULTIVATE A FARM-FRIENDLY STATE FOR LOCAL FOOD (II)** 15PRODUCTION, MARKETING TO RESIDENTS OF THE STATE, AND DISTRIBUTION 16 **TO GOVERNMENT INSTITUTIONS;** 17(III) INCREASE ACCESS TO NUTRITIOUS, AFFORDABLE FOOD, 18 INCLUDING MARYLAND-GROWN FOODS, FOR RESIDENTS OF THE STATE, WITH A 19 FOCUS ON CHILDREN, LOW-INCOME FAMILIES, AT-RISK SENIORS, AND 20**INNER-CITY RESIDENTS:** 21(IV) IMPROVE NUTRITION AT STATE INSTITUTIONS, 22**INCLUDING STATE EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AND CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES;** 23**(V)** MAXIMIZE COORDINATION OF EXISTING FEDERAL, 24STATE, AND LOCAL RESOURCES AND CAPTURE ADDITIONAL FEDERAL 25**RESOURCES FOR THE STATE; AND** 26 (VI) ENHANCE CONNECTIONS AMONG STATE GROWERS AND 27**STATE FOOD OUTLETS: AND** 28**(2) PROMOTE INSTITUTIONAL PURCHASE AND CONSUMPTION OF** 29 MARYLAND-GROWN FOOD PRODUCTS, INCLUDING FOOD PRODUCTS FOR 1 HOSPITALS, CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS, AND HIGHER EDUCATION 2 FACILITIES;

3 (3) RECOMMEND PROGRAMS OR PILOT PROGRAMS THAT WOULD
 4 INCREASE ACCESS TO MARYLAND-GROWN FOODS FOR RESIDENTS OF THE
 5 STATE;

6 (4) IDENTIFY MECHANISMS BY WHICH THE STATE MAY EXPAND 7 MARKETS FOR MARYLAND AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS, INCLUDING 8 "ORGANICALLY PRODUCED" AND "PASTURE-RAISED"; AND

9 (5) RECOMMEND POLICIES AND ACTIVITIES THAT WOULD 10 INCREASE SPENDING OF FOOD DOLLARS IN THE STATE ON MARYLAND-GROWN 11 FOOD PRODUCTS.

12ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE MARYLAND FOOD **(B)** 13AND HUNGER POLICY COUNCIL SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR, THE 14 SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE, AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE 15WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE 16 IMPLEMENTATION, INCLUDING LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY INITIATIVES, OF 17THIS ACT.

18 (C) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2009, THE COUNCIL SHALL ADOPT A
 19 12-MONTH AND 24-MONTH STRATEGIC PLAN FOR ACHIEVING THE DUTIES OF
 20 THE COUNCIL.

(D) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2011, THE COUNCIL SHALL ADOPT A
 36-MONTH STRATEGIC PLAN FOR ACHIEVING THE DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL AND
 ADOPT A NEW STRATEGIC PLAN EVERY 36 MONTHS THEREAFTER.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial appointed members of the Maryland Food and Hunger Policy Council shall expire as follows:

- 27 (1) three members in 2010;
- 28 (2) three members in 2011; and
- $29 \qquad (3) \qquad \text{three members in } 2012.$

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 July 1, 2009.
