# A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

## Vehicle Laws - Bicycles - Rules of the Road

- 3 FOR the purpose of creating an exception for a bicycle operator to the prohibition against passing another vehicle to the right by driving off the roadway; 4 5 establishing that at an intersection, a person operating a bicycle is subject to 6 certain traffic control signals, but that at all other places has the rights and is 7 subject to the restrictions applicable to pedestrians under specified provisions of 8 law; authorizing local jurisdictions to regulate the operation of bicycles on 9 sidewalks; authorizing, under certain circumstances, a person who is operating 10 a bicycle or motor scooter to use the roadway even if a shoulder is present; altering the defined term "bicycle"; altering the defined term "shoulder" to 11 reflect certain authorized uses; and generally relating to the rules of the road 12 for operating bicycles. 13

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 (a) (1) (I) At an intersection, a person [using] OPERATING A BICYCLE
3 OR an EPAMD is subject to all traffic control signals, as provided in §§ 21-202 and
4 21-203 of this title.

5 (II) [However] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 6 SUBSECTION, at any other place, a person [using] OPERATING A BICYCLE OR an 7 EPAMD has the rights and is subject to the restrictions applicable to pedestrians 8 under this title.

## 9 (2) (I) THE PROVISIONS OF § 21–506 OF THIS SUBTITLE 10 GOVERNING PEDESTRIANS ON ROADWAYS DO NOT APPLY TO THE OPERATION OF 11 BICYCLES.

# 12(II) A LOCAL JURISDICTION MAY REGULATE THE13OPERATION OF BICYCLES ON SIDEWALKS.

14 (b) At an intersection, a person using a wheelchair is subject to all traffic 15 control signals, as provided in §§ 21–202 and 21–203 of this title. However, at any 16 other place, a person using a wheelchair has the rights and is subject to the 17 restrictions applicable to pedestrians under this title.

19 (a) Where a sidewalk is provided, a pedestrian may not walk along and on an 20 adjacent roadway.

(b) Where a sidewalk is not provided, a pedestrian who walks along and on a highway may walk only on the left shoulder, if practicable, or on the left side of the roadway, as near as practicable to the edge of the roadway, facing any traffic that might approach from the opposite direction.

26 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not ride a 27 bicycle or a motor scooter:

(1) On any roadway where the posted maximum speed limit is more
 than 50 miles an hour; or

30 (2) On any expressway, except on an adjacent bicycle path or way 31 approved by the State Highway Administration, or on any other controlled access 32 highway signed in accordance with § 21–313 of this title.

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1 (b) (1) WHERE THERE IS NOT A BIKE LANE PAVED TO A SMOOTH 2 SURFACE, A PERSON OPERATING A BICYCLE OR A MOTOR SCOOTER MAY USE 3 THE ROADWAY OR THE SHOULDER.

4 (2) Where there is a bike lane paved to a smooth surface [or a shoulder 5 paved to a smooth surface], a person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter shall use 6 the bike lane [or shoulder] and may not ride on the roadway, except in the following 7 situations:

8 (i) When overtaking and passing another bicycle, motor scooter, 9 pedestrian, or other vehicle within the bike lane [or shoulder] if the overtaking and 10 passing cannot be done safely within the bike lane [or shoulder];

(ii) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into an
 alley, private road, or driveway;

(iii) When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane [or
shoulder] to avoid debris or other hazardous condition; or

(iv) When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane [or
shoulder] because the bike lane [or shoulder] is overlaid with a right turn lane, merge
lane, or other marking that breaks the continuity of the bike lane [or shoulder].

18 [(2)] (3) A person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter may not 19 leave a bike lane [or shoulder] until the movement can be made with reasonable 20 safety and then only after giving an appropriate signal.

[(3)] (4) The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations pertaining to this subsection which will include, but not be limited to, a definition of "smooth surface".

24 (c) A motor scooter may not be operated at a speed in excess of 30 miles per 25 hour.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not
operate an EPAMD on any roadway where there are sidewalks adjacent to the
roadway or the posted maximum speed limit is more than 30 miles an hour.

29 (e) An EPAMD may not be operated at a speed in excess of 15 miles per30 hour.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2009.
