3 4 5 6	FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum annual salary that the Board of Public Works may set for a register of wills; providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of an incumbent register of wills during the current term of office; and generally relating to the salary for the register of wills.

12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
14	Article - Estates and Trusts
15	2–205.
16 17 18	(a) (1) It is the intent of this section that each register shall receive a fair and adequate compensation for the effort and duties required of the register by the register's office.
19 20 21	(2) The volume and character of work done by the register shall be in comparison to the salary fixed by the Board of Public Works for each of the other registers.
22 23 24	(b) (1) Each register is entitled to receive an annual salary of not more than [\$98,500,] \$114,500 , to be determined in each instance by the Board of Public Works.



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1	(2) In determining the annual salary of the register, the Board	of
2	Public Works shall be guided in the exercise of its discretion by:	

- 3 (i) The population of the county determined by the last official 4 United States census;
- 5 (ii) The dollar volume of total fees and taxes collected and excess fees turned over to the State for each of the preceding 5 years by the office of the register for which the salary is being fixed; and
- 8 (iii) Other pertinent data which have relation to the 9 reasonableness of the salary in relation to the work done and volume handled by the 10 office.
- 11 (c) The minimum annual salary for the register in Baltimore City is \$12,000.
- 12 (d) (1) The salaries of the registers shall be paid semimonthly from the 13 fees and receipts of the office, after deducting the expenses of the office.
- 14 (2) Expenses include salaries of deputies and clerks, books, stationery, office supplies, and other necessary and customary expenses of doing business.
 - (e) (1) If the fees and receipts of the office are insufficient in any fiscal year to pay all or a part of the expenses of the office and authorized salary of a register, the deficiency shall be funded from the taxes remitted to the Comptroller of the treasury by the register during that fiscal year. Written authority for the transfer of funds shall be first obtained from the State Comptroller.
- 21 (2) In the event that tax collections for the fiscal year are insufficient, 22 the Comptroller shall make up the deficit from excess fees remitted from all other 23 registers.
 - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 35 of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary or compensation of the registers of wills in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the register of wills shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
