17 (a) The County Commissioners may have signposts placed at road crossings 18 or intersections designating the distance to the nearest prominent point and, subject 19 to [§ 7–208] § **7–307** of this subtitle, may give suitable names to the county roads and 20 change them as they see fit.

(b) The County Commissioners may let out the repair or maintenance of any
road or portion of road by contract, when, in the [Road Engineer's] **DIRECTOR'S**judgment, that course is advisable. In that case preference shall be given, where
practicable to the owners of the land directly interested in the proper care of the road
or roads, and the work shall be done under the supervision of the [Road Engineer] **DIRECTOR**.

(c) All contracts made by the County Commissioners for the repair or
construction of roads or bridges shall be reduced to writing and all payments shall be
subject to the approval by the [Road Engineer] **DIRECTOR** of the work done under the
contract.

(d) (1) Whenever work on any road or bridge involves an outlay of
[\$5,000] \$50,000 or more, plans and specifications for them shall be prepared by the
[Road Engineer] DIVISION or someone designated by the [Road Engineer]
DIRECTOR.

1 (2)Bids for the work shall be [prepared by the Road Engineer and  $\mathbf{2}$ shall be invited by publication at least once a week for 2 successive weeks in such daily 3 paper or papers the County Commissioners designate or by advertisement through 4 electronic medial SOLICITED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 1–106 OF THIS CODE. The 5 County Commissioners do not have to have any work done by contract if, after bids have been received and opened, it is found that the same work can be done at less 6 7 expense by direct employment of the required labor or if an emergency exists of such 8 nature as to require the speedy repair or replacement of a county road, street, alley, 9 highway, or bridge or other construction in connection with it. This subsection does 10 not require bids when the work is to be done by the County [Roads] HIGHWAY Department. 11

12The County Commissioners may adopt regulations regarding the use of (e) 13the roads, streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, and bridges of the county by telephone and 14 telegraph companies, [steam railroads and] RAILROADS, street railways companies, 15gas. [water] WATER. and electric light UTILITY companies, and similar uses, and by 16 individuals and the traveling public. The County Commissioners may adopt 17 regulations they consider necessary for the proper protection of the roads, streets, 18 avenues, lanes, alleys, bridges of the county and the rights of the public in them. They 19 may impose reasonable penalties for the violation of the regulations and may make 20other necessary provisions for their enforcement. All regulations, when adopted and 21recorded in a book or books kept for the purpose, shall have the force and effect of law.

- 22(**f**) The [police] SHERIFF of the county [are] IS charged with the duty of 23enforcing all the regulations. In addition to other methods of enforcement [of all these 24regulations], the County Commissioners may apply to the [courts of equity of the 25State **CIRCUIT COURT** for an injunction to enforce compliance. In this case, it is not 26necessary to make other jurisdictional averment than the threatened breach of these 27regulations, and the courts may grant these injunctions on the allegations being made. 28A certified copy of these regulations is proper evidence in any of the courts of the 29 State.

31 (a) The County Commissioners shall levy, annually, upon the assessable 32 property of the county, at the time for making the county levy, a rate sufficient to pay 33 the interest and the proper amount on the principal of any outstanding road bonds, a 34 rate sufficient to pay the State Highway Administration the amount due for lateral 35 roads or other plans for State aid for road purposes, and a rate to be set by the County 36 Commissioners, not to exceed 40 cents on \$100.

37 (b) The tax so levied and collected within the limits of all incorporated towns 38 or cities, together with all other money receivable by Washington County for road and 39 bridge purposes, including all fines and forfeitures on account of roads and bridges and 40 all taxes collected on stocks and bonds not apportioned to or assessed in any district 41 shall constitute a fund to be known as the General Road and Bridge Fund and may be

1 expended for any lawful road or bridge purpose anywhere in Washington County and 2 for no other purposes.

3 When there are insufficient funds in the county treasury set apart as the (c) 4 General Road and Bridge Fund to meet the demand for an emergency, the County  $\mathbf{5}$ Commissioners may borrow up to \$250,000 in 1 year, on the credit of the county, to be 6 paid out of the road money provided in the next succeeding levy. All bills and claims  $\mathbf{7}$ on account of roads and bridges in the county shall receive the endorsement of the 8 [Road Engineer] **DIRECTOR** before payment and shall be passed upon by the County 9 Commissioners at a regular or adjourned meeting. A bill or claim involving the 10 expenditure of more than \$1,000, and a contract or agreement involving a larger expenditure from the road funds of the county may not be allowed or made except by a 11 majority vote of the County Commissioners. 12

(d) All claims allowed and passed as aforesaid shall be approved by the
President and attested by the Clerk of the County Commissioners. When so approved
an order for the amount of the claim shall be drawn against the county Tax Collector
who shall pay the amount out of the proper funds.

(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

19 (2) "Special road improvement district" means an area of land in the 20 county which has frontage on a substandard private road in which improvements to 21 the road will be funded from special assessments imposed on all the owners of the land 22 in proportion to the lengths of their respective frontages, designated as a special road 23 improvement district by the County Commissioners.

24 (3) "Private road" means a road not previously accepted into the 25 county road system.

26

(4) "Owners" means owners of property included in the district.

(b) The County Commissioners may create special road improvement districts within the confines of the county for the purpose of providing a method of funding the improvement of private roads in the county to county standards prior to acceptance in the county road system. Only land which fronts on the road to be improved shall be included in a district and, of such land, only so much thereof as shall have at least an average depth in one ownership of 100 feet shall be included.

33 (c) The procedures set forth in this subtitle for the creation of a special road 34 improvement district may only be initiated by a petition signed by the owners of the 35 land in the proposed district having over half of the frontage on the road. The petition 36 may be developed and the signatures obtained either by 1 or more of the owners or by 37 the County Commissioners.

1 (d) Upon receipt of a petition or upon their own motion, if the County 2 Commissioners developed and obtained the signatures to the petition, and before a 3 district may be created, the County Commissioners shall:

4 (1) Cause an investigation to be made of the section of road to be 5 improved; the investigation shall include a study of the condition of the road, the 6 width of the [right of way] **RIGHT-OF-WAY**, the ownership and configuration of land 7 fronting on the road, particularly with respect to the frontages and depths of the 8 various tracts adjoining the road, the estimated cost of improving the road and any 9 other matters which the County Commissioners may feel are relevant to the creation 10 of a district; and

11 (2) Cause a public hearing to be held after written notice of the 12 hearing and the purpose thereof has been published 1 time in a newspaper having 13 general circulation in the county and after a copy of the notice has been mailed or 14 delivered to each owner of land in the proposed district. At the hearing, all persons 15 having an interest in the creation of the district shall be heard and be permitted to 16 present any evidence relevant to the person's position in the matter as may be desired.

17(e) After the public hearing is held, the County Commissioners shall decide 18 whether a special road improvement district shall be created for the area in question, 19 or for part of it, and, if the decision is in favor of the creation of a district, it shall cause 20a resolution to be passed outlining its boundaries and giving preliminary approval to 21the land therein as a special road improvement district. Afterwards, the same notice 22of its decision shall be given to the owners as was given of the public hearing. Any 23person aggrieved by the decision of the County Commissioners may appeal to the  $\mathbf{24}$ Circuit Court for Washington County within 10 days following receipt of the notice. If 25no appeal is taken within the period, the action of the County Commissioners shall be 26final and further appeal may not be taken.

(f) Following the decision of the County Commissioners to establish a
district, and after the expiration of the appeal period without an appeal being taken,
the County Commissioners shall:

30 (1) Cause surveys to be made as well as determine the lengths of the
31 various frontages of land abutting the road to be improved assessable under this
32 section for the improvement of the road;

(2) Cause an advertisement for bids for the improvements to the road
to be published at least 2 times in 2 successive weeks in some newspaper of general
circulation in the county;

36 (3) Cause a notice to be mailed or otherwise delivered to all of the
37 owners of assessable frontage on the road setting forth the names of all the owners,
38 the lengths of their respective assessable frontages, the amount of the lowest
39 responsible bid for the improvements and the individual amounts which the County
40 Commissioners propose to assess as the share of each owner; and

1 (4)Pass a resolution rescinding previously given approval if, within  $\mathbf{2}$ the period of 15 days following the mailing or delivery of the last of the notices provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, a petition against the creation of the 3 district, signed by over 75 percent of the owners, is received by the County 4 Commissioners; if so received, the district may not be created. If no petition is 5 received by the County Commissioners within the 15-day period, it shall pass a 6 7 resolution making final the preliminary approval and the district will then be in 8 existence.

9 (g) Following the final creation of the district, the County Commissioners shall bill each of the owners for the amount of the owner's respective share of the costs 10 of the improvements, and the amount of each share shall be a lien against so much of 11 12the land and property of each owner as lies within the boundaries of the district in the 13same manner that real property taxes are liens on the property against which they are 14 assessed. The County Commissioners may collect the shares from each of the owners and, in so doing, have the same powers as now are, or in the future may be, available 15to them for the collection of real property taxes. 16

17 (h) All matters relating to the work to be done in improving any private road 18 under the provisions of this section, including scheduling, shall be under the sole 19 control and supervision of the County Commissioners and, in the matter of scheduling 20 them, the County Commissioners may defer the awarding of a contract for the work 21 until all of the shares are collected by them. At no later than the completion of the 22 work, the road shall be accepted into the county road system.

18 All persons who own improved lands along or adjacent to any [or] OF the improved public highways or roads of Washington County shall cut down and remove 19 20from and along such roads and highways all briars, undergrowth, bushes, and weeds 21on or before June 15 in each year. Upon the failure of any land owner to comply with 22the provisions of this section, the County Commissioners, at the expense of the county, 23shall have such briars, undergrowth, bushes, and weeds cut and removed. The County 24Commissioners shall be reimbursed for all costs and reasonable expenses necessarily 25incurred in this work, to be recovered from the party or parties delaying or refusing to 26cut and remove the briars, undergrowth, bushes, and weeds in the same manner as 27debts of like amounts are recoverable. THIS SECTION DOES NOT SUPERSEDE ANY 28OTHER AUTHORITY THAT MAY HAVE BEEN GRANTED TO THE COUNTY 29 COMMISSIONERS, NOR DOES IT SUBSTITUTE, DIMINISH, OR EXTINGUISH ANY 30 OTHER POWERS THAT THEY MAY HAVE TO REGULATE BRIARS, UNDERGROWTH, 31**BUSHES, OR WEEDS.**
