Maryland Energy Administration - Standards for Televisions

1	AN ACT concerning	

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Energy Administration, on or before a certain date, to adopt certain regulations concerning energy efficiency standards and labeling standards for televisions sold in the State; requiring the Administration, when adopting certain regulations, to consider adopting similar standards to those that have been adopted in certain other states or are being proposed in certain other states; defining certain terms; and generally relating to energy efficiency and labeling standards for televisions sold in the State.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 19 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 20 MEANINGS INDICATED.
- 21 (2) "ACTIVE USE" MEANS A TELEVISION IS CONNECTED TO A 22 POWER SOURCE AND PRODUCES SOUND AND A PICTURE.



1	(3) "DOWNLOAD ACQUISITION MODE" MEANS A TELEVISION:							
2	(I) IS CONNECTED TO A POWER SOURCE;							
3	(II) DOES NOT PRODUCE SOUND OR A PICTURE; AND

10	OR AN INTERNAL SIGNAL.							
11	(B) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2010, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL							
12	ADOPT REGULATIONS CONCERNING ENERGY EFFICIENCY STANDARDS AND							
13	LABELING STANDARDS FOR TELEVISIONS SOLD IN THE STATE.							
14	(C) THE REGULATIONS THAT THE ADMINISTRATION ADOPTS UNDER							
15	THIS SECTION SHALL:							
16	(1) SET MAXIMUM POWER USAGES FOR TELEVISIONS FOR WHEN A							
17	TELEVISION IS:							
18	(I) IN A STANDBY-PASSIVE MODE; AND

27	(3) REQUIRE THAT A TELEVISION AUTOMATICALLY ENTERS A							
28	STANDBY-PASSIVE MODE AFTER A MAXIMUM OF 15 MINUTES WITHOUT SIGNAL							
29	INPUT;

- 5 ACQUISITION MODE; AND
- 6 (5) REQUIRE INFORMATION RELATING TO THE AMOUNT OF
- 7 POWER CONSUMED BY A TELEVISION WHEN THE TELEVISION IS IN ACTIVE USE
- 8 TO BE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED ON ALL PACKAGES CONTAINING A
- 9 TELEVISION.
- 10 (D) WHEN ADOPTING REGULATIONS UNDER THIS SECTION, THE
- 11 ADMINISTRATION SHALL CONSIDER ADOPTING SIMILAR STANDARDS TO THOSE
- 12 THAT HAVE BEEN ADOPTED IN OTHER STATES OR ARE BEING PROPOSED IN
- 13 **OTHER STATES.**
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 15 October 1, 2009.
