1 AN ACT concerning

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Environment – Recycling – Public School Plans

FOR the purpose of requiring a county recycling plan to address the collection, processing, marketing, and disposition of recyclable materials from county public schools; requiring a county to submit a revised recycling plan by a certain date; and generally relating to county recycling plans.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 (e) In preparing a recycling plan, a county may not calculate a tax or 2 mandatory deposit on any beverage container that is enacted by a county or 3 municipality to achieve the recycling goals required under § 9–505 of this title.

4 (f) For the purpose of determining weight, the Department may not preclude 5 the use of portable weigh scales.

6 (G) A COUNTY SHALL REVISE ITS RECYCLING PLAN BY OCTOBER 1, 7 2010, TO ADDRESS THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (B)(10) OF THIS 8 SECTION.
