1 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on 2 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 60 days or a fine not exceeding 3 \$500 or both.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2009.
