- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (d) of this section, a public body 21 may meet in closed session or adjourn an open session to a closed session only to:

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1 (i) the appointment, employment, assignment, promotion, 2 discipline, demotion, compensation, removal, resignation, or performance evaluation of 3 appointees, employees, or officials over whom it has jurisdiction; or

4 (ii) any other personnel matter that affects 1 or more specific 5 individuals;

6 (b) (1) A public body that meets in closed session under this section may 7 not discuss or act on any matter not permitted under subsection (a) of this section.

8 (2) A PUBLIC BODY MAY NOT MEET IN CLOSED SESSION TO 9 DISCUSS OR ACT ON A MATTER UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION IF 10 THE APPOINTEE, EMPLOYEE, OFFICIAL, OR SPECIFIC INDIVIDUAL REQUESTS AN 11 OPEN SESSION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2009.
