A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Judgments – Appeals – Supersedeas Bond**

3 FOR the purpose of limiting the amount of a supersedeas bond required to stay the
4 enforcement of a judgment in certain actions under certain circumstances;
5 providing for a certain exception; providing for the application of this Act; and
6 generally relating to supersedeas bonds.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

15 **12–301.1.**

16 (A) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW OR COURT RULE AND EXCEPT
17 AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, IN AN APPEAL FROM A
18 JUDGMENT ENTERED IN FAVOR OF THE PLAINTIFFS IN AN ACTION CERTIFIED AS
19 A CLASS ACTION OR IN AN ACTION BY MULTIPLE PLAINTIFFS IN WHICH
20 DAMAGES ARE NOT PROVED FOR EACH PLAINTIFF INDIVIDUALLY, THE AMOUNT
21 OF THE SUPERSEDEAS BOND REQUIRED COLLECTIVELY OF ALL APPELLANTS TO
22 STAY ENFORCEMENT OF A JUDGMENT MAY NOT EXCEED \$100,000,000,
23 REGARDLESS OF THE AMOUNT OF THE JUDGMENT.

1 **(B) IF AN APPELLEE PROVES BY A PREPONDERANCE OF THE EVIDENCE**
2 **THAT AN APPELLANT IS DISSIPATING ASSETS OUTSIDE THE ORDINARY COURSE**
3 **OF BUSINESS TO AVOID THE PAYMENT OF A JUDGMENT, THE COURT MAY**
4 **REQUIRE THE APPELLANT TO POST A BOND IN AN AMOUNT UP TO THE FULL**
5 **AMOUNT OF THE JUDGMENT.**

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all
7 civil actions pending on or filed on or after the effective date of this Act.

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2009.
