13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
18	(2) "Foster care recipient" means an individual who:
19 20	(i) Was placed in an out-of-home placement by the Maryland Department of Human Resources; and

- 1 (ii) 1. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the State at $\mathbf{2}$ the time the individual graduated from high school or successfully completed a general 3 equivalency development examination (GED); or 4 2. A. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the 5 State on the individual's [14th] **13TH** birthday; and 6 В. Was adopted out of an out-of-home placement after 7 the individual's [14th] **13TH** birthday. 8 "Out-of-home placement" has the meaning stated in § 5-501 of the (3)9 Family Law Article. 10 "SIBLING" MEANS A YOUNGER CHILD WHO: **(4)** 11 (I)SHARES ONE OR BOTH PARENTS OF A FOSTER CARE 12 RECIPIENT BEFORE THE ADOPTION; AND 13 HAS BEEN ADOPTED BY A SINGLE FAMILY WHERE ONE (II)14 OF THE ADOPTED YOUTH IS 13 YEARS OR OLDER. 15 [(4)] (5) "Tuition" means the charges imposed by a public (i)institution of higher education for enrollment at the institution. 16 17 "Tuition" includes charges for registration and all fees (ii) required as a condition of enrollment. 18 19 Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a foster care (b) recipient is exempt from paying tuition at a public institution of higher education if: 20 21 (i) The foster care recipient is enrolled at the institution on or 22before the date that the foster care recipient reaches the age of 21 years; The foster care recipient is enrolled as a candidate for an 23 (ii) associate's degree or a bachelor's degree; and 2425 The foster care recipient has filed for federal and State (iii) 26 financial aid by March 1 each year. If a foster care recipient receives a scholarship or grant for 27 postsecondary study and is enrolled before the recipient's 21st birthday as a candidate 28 29 for an associate's degree or bachelor's degree at a public institution of higher education, the foster care recipient may not be required to pay the difference between 30 31 the amount of the scholarship or grant and the amount of the tuition.
 - (3) A foster care recipient who is exempt from tuition under this section continues to be exempt until the earlier of:

1	(i) 5 years after first enrolling as a candidate for an associate's
2	degree or a bachelor's degree at a public institution of higher education in the State; or
3	(ii) The date that the foster care recipient is awarded a
4	bachelor's degree.
5	(C) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B)(2) OF THIS SECTION, A
6	SIBLING OF A FOSTER CARE RECIPIENT IS EXEMPT FROM PAYING TUITION AND
7	FEES AT A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.
8	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9	October 1, 2009.
