- FOR the purpose of establishing that the prohibition under certain circumstances against a person making certain vehicle turns until the person has given a turning signal does not apply to a vehicle entering or exiting a roadway circling a rotary traffic island; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the use of turning signals for vehicle turns.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Transportation**

- 17 (a) A person may not turn a vehicle at an intersection, unless the vehicle is 18 in the position required by § 21–601 of this subtitle.
- 19 (b) A person may not turn a vehicle to enter a private road or driveway or otherwise turn a vehicle from a direct course or move it right or left on a roadway or from a shoulder or bikeway onto a roadway, unless the movement can be made with reasonable safety.
- 23 (c) (1) [A] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A person may not, if any other vehicle might be affected by the movement, turn a vehicle

- 3 (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO IS 4 OPERATING A VEHICLE THAT IS ENTERING OR EXITING A ROADWAY CIRCLING A 5 ROTARY TRAFFIC ISLAND.
 - (d) When required, a signal of intention to turn right or left shall be given continuously during at least the last 100 feet traveled by the vehicle before turning; except that a bicyclist may interrupt the turning signal to maintain control of the bicycle.
- 10 (e) If there is an opportunity to signal, a person may not stop or suddenly decrease the speed of a vehicle until [he] **THE PERSON** gives an appropriate signal in the manner required by this subtitle to the driver of any other vehicle immediately to the rear.
- 14 (f) The signals provided for in § 21–605(b) and (c) of this subtitle:
- 15 (1) May be used to indicate an intention to turn, change lanes, or start 16 from a stopped, standing, or parked position; and
- 17 (2) May not be flashed as a courtesy or "do pass" signal to the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
