5 6 7	(A) A PERSON ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF SELLING AMMUNITION WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY FOR EACH VIOLATION NOT EXCEEDING \$500 IMPOSED BY THE SECRETARY.
8 9	(B) IN SETTING THE AMOUNT OF A CIVIL PENALTY UNDER THIS SECTION, THE SECRETARY SHALL CONSIDER:
10	(1) THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE VIOLATION;
11	(2) THE GOOD FAITH OF THE VIOLATOR;
12	(3) ANY PREVIOUS VIOLATIONS; AND
13	(4) ANY OTHER RELEVANT FACTORS.
