- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

- 20 9–209.
- 21 (a) This section applies only in Charles County.

(d) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the
Board of License Commissioners may not issue any license to sell alcoholic beverages
in any building the nearest wall of which measured in a direct line is within 500 feet of

the property line of any [church or other place of worship or any] school accredited by
 the State Board of Education.

3 (2) This subsection is not applicable in the event the [church or other 4 place of worship or the] school locates its building within 500 feet of any licensed 5 premises after the licensed premises are located there.

6 (3) This subsection does not apply to a Class B (on-sale) beer, wine 7 and liquor license that is issued for a premises located in a municipal corporation in 8 Charles County.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 July 1, 2009.
