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20 (b) To the extent that funds are provided in the State budget, the 21Department may provide assistance equal to 50% of the cost of in–State tuition for any 22regularly scheduled undergraduate credit course, GRADUATE CREDIT COURSE, 23PROFESSIONAL CREDIT COURSE, vocational-technical course, or trade course for $\mathbf{24}$ any active member attending an institution who is certified as eligible by the Adjutant 25General.

26 The Adjutant General may not certify a member as eligible unless (c) (1)27the member is:

28enlisted and has at least 24 months remaining to serve on (i) 29the current enlistment of the member; or

30 (ii) an officer or warrant officer and agrees in writing to serve 31for a minimum of 24 months.

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1 (2) The 24-month requirement runs from the first day of classes for 2 the semester.

3 (d) If a recipient of tuition assistance under this section is discharged from 4 the National Guard for a reason designated by the Adjutant General, the assistance 5 terminates and the member shall reimburse the Department the amount of tuition 6 assistance received for that semester within 30 days of discharge.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJuly 1, 2009.
