# 1 AN ACT concerning

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# Public Health Surveillance - Confidentiality

- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding certain requirements for confidentiality relating to certain reports on certain conditions or diseases by physicians, certain 4 5 institutions, and certain medical laboratories so as to require that all information collected in connection with a report, the subject of the report, or 6 7 other individuals who might be affected by the condition or disease in the 8 report are subject to those requirements; making certain exceptions; and 9 generally relating to the confidentiality of certain information related to certain conditions or diseases. 10

# 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
