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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Services – Power of the Director of the Division of Parole and**  
3 **Probation – Authorization to Execute Warrants**

4 FOR the purpose of adding to the powers of the Director of the Division of Parole and  
5 Probation the power to authorize certain employees of the Division to execute  
6 warrants for the arrest of probationers for whom a warrant is issued for an  
7 alleged violation of probation; and generally relating to the power of the  
8 Director of the Division of Parole and Probation.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
10 Article – Correctional Services  
11 Section 6–106  
12 Annotated Code of Maryland  
13 (2008 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement)

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Correctional Services**

17 6–106.

18 (a) The Director may authorize parole and probation employees of the  
19 Division to:

20 (1) execute warrants for the retaking of offenders;

21 (2) **EXECUTE WARRANTS FOR THE ARREST OF PROBATIONERS**  
22 **FOR WHOM A WARRANT IS ISSUED FOR AN ALLEGED VIOLATION OF PROBATION;**

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1                    [(2)] (3)      obtain and execute search warrants as authorized under §  
2 6–109 of this subtitle; and

3                    [(3)] (4)      arrest offenders in the program as authorized under § 2–207  
4 of the Criminal Procedure Article.

5            (b)    A parole and probation employee who is authorized to make arrests  
6 under this section shall:

7                    (1)      meet the minimum qualifications required by the Maryland Police  
8 Training Commission; and

9                    (2)      complete satisfactorily the training prescribed by the Maryland  
10 Police Training Commission.

11            SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
12 October 1, 2009.
