4 FOR the purpose of repealing certain contested case hearing provisions related to  
5 permitting decisions by the Department of the Environment; authorizing  
6 judicial review of certain permitting and license decisions by the Department or  
7 the Board of Public Works at the request of certain persons who meet certain  
8 federal standing requirements and participate in a certain public participation  
9 process; establishing that under certain circumstances judicial review is  
10 available and a contested case hearing is prohibited; providing for the scope of  
11 judicial review; requiring a certain petition for judicial review to be filed with a  
12 certain circuit court; establishing procedures for filing a petition for judicial

27 months following receipt of the request for a contested case hearing by the Office of  
28 Administrative Hearings.

1 (a) (1) It is the intent of the General Assembly to establish consolidated  
2 procedures and notice and hearing requirements for Title 5, Subtitles 5 and 9 and  
3 Titles 14, 15, and 16 of this article in order to ensure efficient review and consistent  
4 decision making.

5 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of the State Government Article,  
6 public notice on pending applications provided in accordance with the provisions of  
7 this section shall be the only notice required by law.

8 (b) (1) Applicants shall ascertain the names and addresses of all current  
9 owners of property contiguous to the parcel upon which the proposed activity will  
10 occur and personally or by certified mail serve notice upon each owner.

11 (2) Applicants shall serve personally or by certified mail appropriate  
12 local officials.

13 (3) Applicants shall provide the Department with certification that  
14 notice has been served on all contiguous property owners and appropriate local  
15 officials.

16 (4) Upon substantial completion of an application the Department  
17 shall draft a public notice that includes:

18 (i) The name and address of the applicant;

19 (ii) A description of the location and nature of the activity for  
20 which application has been made;

21 (iii) The name, address, and telephone number of the office  
22 within the Department from which information about the application may be obtained;

23 (iv) A statement that any further notices about actions on the  
24 application will be provided only by mail to those persons on a mailing list of  
25 interested persons;

26 (v) A description of how persons may submit information or  
27 comments about the application, request a public informational hearing, or request to  
28 be included on the mailing list of interested persons; and

29 (vi) A deadline for the close of the public comment period by  
30 which information, comments, or requests must be received by the Department.

31 (5) The Department shall prepare a public notice to be published for at  
32 least 1 business day in a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the  
33 proposed activity would occur. At its discretion, the Department shall:

34 (i) Publish the public notice; or

1 (ii) Direct the applicant to publish the public notice.

2 (6) The applicant shall bear the cost of the newspaper notice.

3 (7) The Department shall mail public notices to a general subscription  
4 mailing list.

5 (8) Comments on an application or requests for a public informational  
6 hearing must be forwarded in writing to the Department prior to the close of the  
7 public comment period specified in the public notice.

8 (9) The Department shall compile an interested persons list  
9 containing the names of all contiguous property owners, appropriate local officials, and  
10 individuals that comment on, request hearings, or make inquiries about an application  
11 during any phase of the Department's review.

12 (10) No further notice will be provided except to persons on the  
13 interested persons list.

14 (c) The Department shall hold a public informational hearing if it receives a  
15 timely written request in accordance with the following provisions:

16 (1) The request shall be received prior to the close of the public  
17 comment period.

18 (2) A public informational hearing shall be held within 45 calendar  
19 days of the close of the public comment period.

20 (3) The Department shall specify the date, time, and location of the  
21 public hearing.

22 (4) The Department shall mail notice of the date, time, and location of  
23 any public informational hearing on an application to those persons on the interested  
24 persons list no later than 14 calendar days prior to the hearing.

25 (5) The Department may extend the official record of a public  
26 informational hearing.

27 (d) Following the application review and comment period and within 30  
28 calendar days after the close of the public informational hearing record, the  
29 Department shall issue, modify, or deny the permit or license unless extenuating  
30 circumstances justify an extension of time.

31 (e) The Department shall mail notice of a decision to issue, modify, or deny a  
32 permit or license to the applicant and to those persons on the interested persons list.

1 [(f) When opportunity for a contested case hearing on the Department's  
2 decision to issue, modify, or deny a permit or license is provided by law, the  
3 Department shall provide all persons on the interested persons list and the applicant  
4 an opportunity to make a written request for a contested case hearing within 14  
5 calendar days of the mailing date of the notice of decision.

6 (g) Upon written request the Department shall grant a contested case  
7 hearing if it determines that:

8 (1) The requester has a specific right, duty, privilege, or interest which  
9 is or may be adversely affected by the permit determination or license decision and  
10 which is different from that held by the general public;

11 (2) The requester raises adjudicable issues which are within the scope  
12 of the permit authority; and

13 (3) The request is timely.]
