A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning 1 2 Vehicle Laws - Motor Scooters - Prohibited Roads for Operation 3 FOR the purpose of altering the posted maximum speed limit for a roadway above which a person is prohibited from operating a motor scooter on the roadway; 4 5 making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the operation of motor scooters on roadways. 6 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 8 Article – Transportation 9 Section 21–1205.1 Annotated Code of Maryland 10 (2006 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement) 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 14 **Article - Transportation** 21–1205.1. 15 16 **(1)** Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not (a) 17 ride a bicycle [or a motor scooter: 18 **(1)** On any] ON: 19 A roadway where the posted maximum speed limit is more (I)20 than 50 miles an hour; or

- [(2)] (II) [On any] AN expressway, except on an adjacent bicycle path or way approved by the State Highway Administration, or on any other controlled access highway signed in accordance with § 21–313 of this title.
 - (2) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS TITLE, A PERSON MAY NOT OPERATE A MOTOR SCOOTER ON:
- 6 1. A ROADWAY WHERE THE POSTED MAXIMUM 7 SPEED LIMIT IS MORE THAN 30 MILES AN HOUR; OR
- 2. AN EXPRESSWAY, EXCEPT ON AN ADJACENT BICYCLE PATH OR WAY APPROVED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION, OR ON ANY OTHER CONTROLLED ACCESS HIGHWAY SIGNED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 21–313 OF THIS TITLE.
- 12 (II) A PERSON MAY NOT OPERATE A MOTOR SCOOTER AT A SPEED IN EXCESS OF 30 MILES PER HOUR.
- 14 (3) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS
 15 TITLE, A PERSON MAY NOT OPERATE AN EPAMD ON A ROADWAY WHERE THE
 16 POSTED MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT IS MORE THAN 30 MILES AN HOUR.
- 17 (II) A PERSON MAY NOT OPERATE AN **EPAMD** AT A SPEED 18 IN EXCESS OF 15 MILES PER HOUR.
- 19 (b) (1) Where there is a bike lane paved to a smooth surface or a shoulder 20 paved to a smooth surface, a person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter shall use the 21 bike lane or shoulder and may not ride on the roadway, except in the following 22 situations:
- 23 (i) When overtaking and passing another bicycle, motor scooter, 24 pedestrian, or other vehicle within the bike lane or shoulder if the overtaking and 25 passing cannot be done safely within the bike lane or shoulder;
- 26 (ii) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into an alley, private road, or driveway;
- 28 (iii) When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane or 29 shoulder to avoid debris or other hazardous condition; or
- 30 (iv) When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane or 31 shoulder because the bike lane or shoulder is overlaid with a right turn lane, merge 32 lane, or other marking that breaks the continuity of the bike lane or shoulder.

- 1 (2) A person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter may not leave a 2 bike lane or shoulder until the movement can be made with reasonable safety and 3 then only after giving an appropriate signal.
- 4 (3) The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations pertaining to this subsection which will include, but not be limited to, a definition of "smooth surface".
- 7 (c) [A motor scooter may not be operated at a speed in excess of 30 miles per 8 hour.
- 9 (d)] Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not 10 operate an EPAMD on any roadway where there are sidewalks adjacent to the 11 roadway [or the posted maximum speed limit is more than 30 miles an hour.
- 12 (e) An EPAMD may not be operated at a speed in excess of 15 miles per 13 hour].
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
