BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Education** 12 13 7 - 804. In this section, "school vehicle" has the meaning stated in § 11-154 of the 14 (a) Transportation Article. 15 Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, 16 (b) unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety standards, a 17 school vehicle may be operated for 12 years. 18 19 (2)In Dorchester, Somerset, TALBOT, Wicomico, and Worcester 20 counties, unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety

standards, a school vehicle may be operated for 15 years.
