1 AN ACT concerning

Commission on Gambling Addiction

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission on Gambling Addiction in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing for the membership, 4 5 terms, quorum, and meetings of the Commission; providing Commission members with reimbursement for expenses under certain circumstances; 6 7 specifying that the purpose of the Commission is to study the effects of individuals who are addicted to gambling, to measure the cost of gambling 8 9 addiction, and to propose certain solutions; authorizing the Commission to consult with certain units of State government and establish certain committees 10 or task forces; requiring the Commission to develop certain plans and studies, 11 promote collaboration and coordination with certain programs, and perform 12 13 certain other tasks; requiring the Commission to submit a certain report to the Governor and the General Assembly by a certain date; providing for the 14 staggering of the terms of certain members of the Commission; defining a 15 certain term; and generally relating to the Commission on Gambling Addiction. 16

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 3 (B) THERE IS A COMMISSION ON GAMBLING ADDICTION IN THE 4 DEPARTMENT.
- 5 (C) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF 17 VOTING MEMBERS AND 3 6 NONVOTING MEMBERS.
- 7 (D) THE VOTING MEMBERS ARE:
- 8 (1) SEVEN MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH RELEVANT INTEREST
- 9 OR EXPERTISE IN THE PROBLEMS POSED BY GAMBLING ADDICTION, APPOINTED
- 10 BY THE GOVERNOR; AND
- 11 (2) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, WHO SHALL SERVE EX OFFICIO:
- 12 (I) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE,
- 13 OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;
- 14 (II) THE SECRETARY OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND

3	(E) THE NONVOTING MEMBERS, WHO SHALL SERVE EX OFFICIO, ARE:
4	(1) THE DIRECTOR OF THE MENTAL HYGIENE ADMINISTRATION;
5	(2) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF PAROLE AND
6	PROBATION; AND
7 8	(3) THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF TREATMENT SERVICES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.
9 10	(F) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER WHO DOES NOT SERVE EX OFFICIO IS 3 YEARS AND BEGINS ON JULY 1.
11	(2) The terms of members who do not serve ex officio
12	ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS ON
13	OCTOBER 1, 2009.
14	(3) A MEMBER WHO DOES NOT SERVE EX OFFICIO MAY SERVE
15	NOT MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS.
16	(4) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve
17	UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
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- 18 (5) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN
- 19 SERVES ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS
- 20 APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 21 (G) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE ANY MEMBER FOR INCOMPETENCE 22 OR NEGLECT.
- 23 (H) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT ONE OF THE MEMBERS TO SERVE 24 AS CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION.
- 25 (I) (1) A MAJORITY OF THE VOTING MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION 26 IS A QUORUM.
- 27 **(2)** THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH 28 YEAR.

- 3 (J) EACH MEMBER IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES 4 UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE
- 5 STATE BUDGET.

6 (K) THE COMMISSION SHALL:

- 7 (1) STUDY THE EFFECTS OF INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE SO ADDICTED
- 8 TO GAMBLING THAT THEIR ADDICTION SERIOUSLY DISRUPTS THEIR LIVES AND
- 9 THE LIVES OF THEIR FAMILIES;
- 10 (2) MEASURE THE COST OF GAMBLING ADDICTION TO THE
- 11 TAXPAYERS OF MARYLAND; AND
- 12 (3) Propose solutions to the threat gambling addiction
- 13 POSES TO THE RESIDENTS OF THE STATE.
- 14 (L) THE COMMISSION MAY:
- 15 (1) CONSULT WITH UNITS OF STATE GOVERNMENT TO OBTAIN
- 16 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND ADVICE; AND
- 17 (2) ESTABLISH COMMITTEES OR TASK FORCES THAT IT
- 18 CONSIDERS NECESSARY AND DESIGNATE ADDITIONAL INDIVIDUALS, INCLUDING
- 19 INTERESTED STATE RESIDENTS, ELECTED OFFICIALS, EDUCATORS, OR
- 20 SPECIALISTS WITH RELEVANT EXPERTISE TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEES.
- 21 (M) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- 22 (1) DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE, COORDINATED, AND
- 23 COLLABORATIVE APPROACH TO THE USE OF STATE AND LOCAL RESOURCES FOR
- 24 THE PREVENTION OF, INTERVENTION IN, AND TREATMENT OF GAMBLING
- 25 ADDICTION AMONG THE RESIDENTS OF THE STATE:
- 26 (2) PROMOTE THE COORDINATED PLANNING AND DELIVERY OF
- 27 STATE PREVENTION, INTERVENTION, EVALUATION, AND TREATMENT
- 28 RESOURCES TO COMBAT GAMBLING ADDICTION;
- 29 (3) PROMOTE COLLABORATION AND COORDINATION BY
- 30 APPROPRIATE STATE PROGRAMS WITH LOCAL GAMBLING TREATMENT
- 31 **PROGRAMS**;

- 1 **(4)** IDENTIFY, DEVELOP, AND RECOMMEND THE 2 **IMPLEMENTATION** OF COMPREHENSIVE, **SYSTEMIC IMPROVEMENT** IN 3 PROVIDING PREVENTION, INTERVENTION, AND TREATMENT SERVICES FOR 4 **GAMBLING ADDICTS:**
- 5 (5) PREPARE A STUDY TO MEASURE THE COSTS, BOTH IN HUMAN 6 AND FINANCIAL TERMS, OF GAMBLING ADDICTION IN THE STATE;
- 7 (6) PREPARE A PLAN ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES AND 8 STRATEGIES FOR THE DELIVERY AND FUNDING OF STATE PREVENTION, 9 INTERVENTION, AND TREATMENT SERVICES FOR GAMBLING ADDICTS;
- 10 (7) COORDINATE WITH THE GOVERNOR'S GRANTS OFFICE IN
 11 EFFORTS TO SEEK FUNDS FROM ALL APPROPRIATE SOURCES FOR THE
 12 PREVENTION OF, INTERVENTION IN, AND TREATMENT OF GAMBLING
 13 ADDICTION; AND
- 14 (8) RECEIVE, REVIEW, AND SERVE AS A REPOSITORY FOR
 15 STUDIES AND EVALUATIONS OF STATE AND LOCAL GAMBLING ADDICTION
 16 PROGRAMS AND OTHER RELEVANT MATERIALS AND MAKE THE INFORMATION
 17 AVAILABLE TO UNITS OF STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT.
- 18 (N) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2010, AND FOR EVERY YEAR THEREAFTER, 19 THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON ITS PROGRESS TO THE 20 GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, 21 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 22 (O) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT 23 THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the members of the Commission on October 1, 2009, not serving ex officio end as follows:
- 26 (1) two on September 30, 2010;
