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- FOR the purpose of repealing a requirement that the Department of Agriculture adopt certain regulations creating a certain Organic Certification Program that meets the requirements of a certain federal law; requiring the Organic Certification Program established by the Department to conform to a certain federal law; eliminating the limit at which the Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to set a certain fee; and generally relating to the Organic Certification Program within the Department of Agriculture.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- The Department shall establish [a certification program] THE ORGANIC
- 20 **CERTIFICATION PROGRAM** governing the production and handling of organic

- ORGANIC CERTIFICATION PROGRAM ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT
- 3 SHALL CONFORM TO the requirements of the federal Organic Food Production Act. 7
- 4 U.S.C. § 6501 et seq., INCLUDING IMPLEMENTING FEDERAL REGULATIONS AND
- ALL SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS AND REVISIONS. 5

- A person may not represent any uncertified commodity as certified under 7 (a) 8 this subtitle.
- 9 (b) In addition to the denial, suspension, or revocation of a [permit] 10 **CERTIFICATE** issued under this subtitle, the Secretary may impose a civil penalty of not more than \$1,000 for a violation of this section. 11
- 12 Each uncertified commodity represented as certified constitutes a (c) 13 separate violation of this section.
- 14 (d) Penalties collected by the Secretary under this section shall be paid into 15 the General Fund of the State.

- 17 The Secretary shall set a reasonable fee, not to exceed \$500. to defray the cost of conducting field inspections and laboratory analysis as required by the United 18 19 States Department of Agriculture's Organic Food Program for accredited certifying 20 agents.
- 21SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2009.
