SUPERVISION OF A VETERINARY PRACTITIONER AS DEFINED BY § 2–301(C) OF THE AGRICULTURE ARTICLE who, for no fee or compensation, renders veterinary aid, care, or assistance in an emergency situation in which the owner or custodian of the animal is not available to grant permission, is not liable for any civil damages as the result of any professional act or omission by the person not amounting to gross negligence.
