CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Hate Crimes – Prohibitions and Protected Classes – Homeless Persons and**
3 **Groups**

4 FOR the purpose of including homeless persons within the scope of certain
5 prohibitions against committing certain crimes against certain persons,
6 damaging certain property of certain persons, burning certain objects, and
7 damaging certain buildings with which certain persons or groups have contacts
8 or associations or under circumstances exhibiting animosity against a certain
9 person or group; defining a certain term; and generally relating to hate crimes
10 against homeless persons.

11 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

13 Section 10–301, 10–304, and 10–305

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Criminal Law**

19 10–301.

1 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
2 INDICATED.

3 (B) **“HOMELESS” MEANS:**

4 (1) LACKING A FIXED, REGULAR, AND ADEQUATE NIGHTTIME
5 RESIDENCE; OR

6 (2) HAVING A PRIMARY NIGHTTIME RESIDENCE THAT IS:

7 (I) A SUPERVISED PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY OPERATED
8 SHELTER DESIGNED TO PROVIDE TEMPORARY LIVING ACCOMMODATIONS; OR

9 (II) A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PLACE NOT DESIGNED FOR OR
10 ORDINARILY USED AS A REGULAR SLEEPING ACCOMMODATION FOR HUMAN
11 BEINGS.

12 (C) [In this subtitle, “sexual] **“SEXUAL** orientation” means the identification
13 of an individual as to male or female homosexuality, heterosexuality, bisexuality, or
14 gender-related identity.

15 10-304.

16 Because of another’s race, color, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, or national
17 origin, **OR BECAUSE ANOTHER IS HOMELESS**, a person may not:

18 (1) (i) commit a crime against that person;

19 (ii) damage the real or personal property of that person;

20 (iii) deface, damage, or destroy, or attempt to deface, damage, or
21 destroy the real or personal property of that person; or

22 (iv) burn or attempt to burn an object on the real or personal
23 property of that person; or

24 (2) commit a violation of item (1) of this section that:

25 (i) except as provided in item (ii) of this item, involves a
26 separate crime that is a felony; or

27 (ii) results in the death of the victim.

28 10-305.

1 A person may not deface, damage, or destroy, attempt to deface, damage, or
2 destroy, burn or attempt to burn an object on, or damage the real or personal property
3 connected to a building that is publicly or privately owned, leased, or used, including a
4 cemetery, library, meeting hall, recreation center, or school:

5 (1) because a person or group of a particular race, color, religious
6 belief, sexual orientation, or national origin, **OR BECAUSE A PERSON OR GROUP**
7 **THAT IS HOMELESS**, has contacts or is associated with the building; or

8 (2) if there is evidence that exhibits animosity against a person or
9 group, because of the race, color, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, or national origin
10 of that person or group **OR BECAUSE THAT PERSON OR GROUP IS HOMELESS.**

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2009.
