## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 State Highway Administration – Snow Removal – Use of Farm Trucks

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Highway Administration to request the use of certain farm trucks to assist in snow removal under certain circumstances; 4 authorizing the owner of a farm truck to refuse to allow the Administration to 5 6 use the farm truck; requiring the Administration to compensate the owner of a 7 farm truck that is used by the Administration for snow removal; providing that 8 the provisions of this Act apply only if a farm truck meets certain minimum 9 requirements; authorizing the Administration to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the use of farm trucks by the 10 State Highway Administration for snow removal. 11
