1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment – Green Building Council**

3 FOR the purpose of expanding the responsibilities of the Green Building Council to
4 include providing certain recommendations on how to expand green building;
5 repealing certain obsolete dates; expanding the scope of certain
6 recommendations that the Council is required to make relating to the
7 implementation of a certain building program; and generally relating to the
8 Green Building Council.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

2 (a) There is a Maryland Green Building Council.

3 (f) [On or before September 30, 2007, the] **THE** Maryland Green Building
4 Council shall:

5 (1) evaluate current high performance building technologies;

6 (2) provide recommendations concerning the most cost-effective green
7 building technologies that the State might consider requiring in the construction of
8 State facilities, including consideration of the additional cost associated with the
9 various technologies; [and]

10 **(3) PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING HOW TO EXPAND**
11 **GREEN BUILDING IN THE STATE; AND**

12 [(3)] (4) develop a list of building types for which green building
13 technologies should not be applied, taking into consideration the operational aspects of
14 facilities evaluated, and the utility of a waiver process where appropriate.

15 (g) On or before [November 1, 2007, and every year thereafter] **NOVEMBER**
16 **1 OF EACH YEAR**, the Council shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly,
17 in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, as to recommendations
18 for the implementation plan for a [State] higher performance building program **IN**
19 **THE STATE** and any progress that has been made during the preceding year.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 2009.
