3 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the Garrett County Salary Study
4 Commission study the salary of the State's Attorney; authorizing the
5 Commission to recommend to the County Commissioners certain changes to the
6 salary of the State's Attorney; and generally relating to the salary of the State's
7 Attorney of Garrett County.

11 Article 12 – Public Local Laws of Maryland
12 (2005 Edition and 2007 Supplement, as amended)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 12 – Garrett County**

17 (A) The Commission shall study the salaries of the:

18 (1) County Commissioners;

19 (2) Board of Education;

6 (B) The Commission may recommend to the County Commissioners an
 7 increase or decrease in the salary of **THE STATE'S ATTORNEY, OR** any office in
 8 division (A) of this section.

9 (C) The Commission shall report its recommendations to the County
 10 Commissioners on or before June 30, 1997, and on or before June 30 every fourth year
 11 thereafter.

12 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That this Act shall take effect
 13 October 1, 2009.
