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## **Education - MDK12 Digital Library**

FOR the purpose of establishing the MDK12 Digital Library in the State Department 3 of Education; establishing certain legislative findings; establishing the purpose 4 of the MDK12 Digital Library; establishing a steering committee within the 5 MDK12 Digital Library; establishing the membership of the steering committee: 6 establishing certain duties of the steering committee; establishing the 7 8 membership of the MDK12 Digital Library, subject to certain limitations: 9 establishing certain limitations to the membership of the MDK12 Digital Library; requiring certain individuals to perform certain duties; authorizing the 10 MDK12 Digital Library to develop certain additional programs that support all 11 residents of Maryland; requiring the Department to employ a certain position; 12 requiring a certain report to be submitted by a certain date to the Department: 13 14 defining a certain term; and generally relating to the MDK12 Digital Library.
