# A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

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# **Rental Vehicle Parking Ticket Fairness Act**

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing a provision of law that provides that an owner of a 4 rental vehicle is not liable for any penalty in excess of the original fine for a 5 parking violation under certain circumstances; providing that the owner of a 6 rental vehicle for which a parking citation is issued is not liable for payment of 7 the fine or for any penalty in excess of the fine if the rental vehicle was in the 8 possession of a lessee of the vehicle at the time the parking citation was issued 9 and if, within a certain period of time of receiving a mailed notice of the violation, the owner sends certain information in a certain manner to the 10 11 appropriate political subdivision or State agency; authorizing a political subdivision or State agency to mail a certain citation under certain 12 circumstances; prohibiting a political subdivision or State agency from 13 14 authorizing the placement of a certain wheel clamp on a rental vehicle; defining 15certain terms; and generally relating to parking citations for rental vehicles.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article – Transportation

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1 (a) In this subtitle, "officer" means a police officer or a person other than a 2 police officer who is authorized to issue a citation for a violation of an ordinance or 3 regulation that is adopted under this section.

4 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, any State agency authorized by 5 law and any political subdivision of this State may adopt ordinances or regulations 6 that:

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(1) Regulate the parking of vehicles;

8 (2) Provide for the impounding of vehicles parked in violation of the 9 ordinances or regulations;

10 (3) Regulate the towing of vehicles from publicly owned and privately
 11 owned parking lots; and

12 (4) Provide for the issuance of a citation by an officer for a violation of13 an ordinance or regulation that is adopted under this section.

14 (c) A political subdivision may not adopt or enforce an ordinance or 15 regulation that prohibits the parking of more than one motorcycle within a space 16 served by a single parking meter.

17(d)(1)[In this subsection, "rental]IN THIS SUBSECTION THE18FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

19(II) "LESSEE" MEANS A PERSON WHO RENTS OR LEASES A20RENTAL VEHICLE FROM THE OWNER OF THE RENTAL VEHICLE.

(III) "RENTAL vehicle" means a vehicle that is rented or leased
 for a period not exceeding 180 days.

(IV) "WHEEL CLAMP" MEANS A DEVICE, COMMONLY KNOWN
AS A "BOOT", THAT IS PLACED ON A WHEEL OF A VEHICLE IN ORDER TO
IMMOBILIZE THE VEHICLE.

[(2) If a parking citation is issued for a rental vehicle, the owner is not liable for any penalty in excess of the original fine for a parking violation unless the owner fails to pay the fine or file a notice of intention to stand trial for the violation within the time specified in a notice of the infraction mailed to the business address of the owner.]

(2) THE OWNER OF A RENTAL VEHICLE FOR WHICH A PARKING
 CITATION IS ISSUED IS NOT LIABLE FOR PAYMENT OF THE FINE OR OF ANY
 PENALTY IN EXCESS OF THE FINE IF:

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1 **(I)** THE RENTAL VEHICLE WAS IN THE POSSESSION OF A  $\mathbf{2}$ LESSEE OF THE RENTAL VEHICLE AT THE TIME THE PARKING CITATION WAS 3 **ISSUED; AND** 4 **(II)** WITHIN 30 DAYS OF RECEIVING A MAILED NOTICE OF 5 THE VIOLATION FOR WHICH THE PARKING CITATION WAS ISSUED, THE OWNER 6 ELECTRONICALLY SENDS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION TO THE APPROPRIATE 7 **POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR STATE AGENCY:** 8 1. **THE VIOLATION REFERENCE NUMBER:** 9 2. THE NAME, ADDRESS, TELEPHONE NUMBER, AND 10 DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER OF THE LESSEE OF THE RENTAL VEHICLE; 11 3. THE NAME OF THE STATE IN WHICH THE RENTAL 12**VEHICLE IS REGISTERED AND THE RENTAL VEHICLE'S REGISTRATION NUMBER:** 13 AND 14 4. THE OWNER'S RENTAL AGREEMENT NUMBER OR 15TRANSACTION NUMBER IDENTIFYING THE RENTAL VEHICLE AS BEING SUBJECT 16 TO A VALID RENTAL AGREEMENT AT THE TIME OF THE VIOLATION. 17A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR STATE AGENCY THAT RECEIVES (3) 18 INFORMATION CONCERNING A LESSEE UNDER PARAGRAPH (2)(II) OF THIS 19 SUBSECTION MAY MAIL A CITATION TO THE LESSEE. 20 **[**(3)**]**(4) If a political subdivision or State agency receives payment 21for a parking violation from both the owner of the vehicle and the person who had 22possession of the rental vehicle at the time the parking citation was issued, the political subdivision or State agency shall reimburse the owner of the vehicle for the 23amount paid by the owner for the violation. 2425A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR STATE AGENCY MAY NOT (5) 26AUTHORIZE THE PLACEMENT OF A WHEEL CLAMP ON A RENTAL VEHICLE. Any State agency authorized by law and any political subdivision of the 27(e) 28State may establish public outreach efforts to educate law enforcement officers. businesses, medical practitioners, and the general public as to parking laws and 2930 regulations, including: 31The authority of law enforcement officers to enter private parking (1)32 lots used by the public; and

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1 (2) Specific eligibility criteria for, and requirements for the lawful use 2 of, special registration plates and placards issued under Title 13, Subtitle 6 of this 3 article for individuals with disabilities.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2009.
