## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Buying of Minors – Prohibition**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from buying or offering to buy a minor for  
4 money, property, or anything else of value; establishing that certain penalties  
5 apply to a violation of this Act; establishing that a person who violates this Act  
6 is subject to a provision of law that authorizes the State to institute a  
7 prosecution for the offense at any time and, for purposes of the Maryland  
8 Constitution, that deems the person to have committed an offense the  
9 punishment for which is confinement in the penitentiary, and who may reserve  
10 a point or question for a certain in banc review; and generally relating to the  
11 crime of buying a minor.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Criminal Law**

20 3–603.

21 (a) A person may not sell, barter, **BUY**, or trade, or offer to sell, barter, **BUY**,  
22 or trade, a minor for money, property, or anything else of value.

23 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on  
24 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 5 years or a fine not exceeding  
25 \$10,000 or both for each violation.

1           (c)     A person who violates this section is subject to § 5–106(b) of the Courts  
2 Article.

3           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
4 October 1, 2009.
