4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	FOR the purpose of requiring the Developmental Disabilities Administration to select a certain service provider to develop and implement an Adult Autism Care Training Program; providing for the purpose of the Program; providing certain eligibility criteria for certain service providers; requiring an eligible service provider to submit a certain proposal to be considered for selection by the Administration; requiring the payment of certain rate enhancements to certain service providers under certain circumstances; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the care of adults with autism spectrum disorders.

19 20 21	WHEREAS, Autism is a complex developmental disability that typically appears during the first 3 years of life and affects a person's ability to communicate and interact with others; and
22 23	WHEREAS, There is no known single cause for autism, but increased awareness and funding can help families today; and
$\begin{array}{c} 24 \\ 25 \end{array}$	WHEREAS, Maryland faces growing numbers of adults with autism who need well–trained, consistent, and professional staff to provide quality support services; and



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$1\\2\\3\\4$	WHEREAS, Low reimbursement rates for residential and day services inhibit existing developmental disability providers from being able to offer specialized training to direct support workers so that the workers are prepared to meet the highly varied needs of adults with autism; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, The behavioral needs of individuals diagnosed with autism require an extensive and expensive array of supports so that these individuals can remain safe and become integrated into their communities; and
8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, The Developmental Disabilities Administration funding rates do not account for any allocation in funding for any initial staff training, fail to provide funding for annual training requirements for staff, and do not reimburse for training resulting from turnover that is a consequence of the inadequate funding rates; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, Maryland shall fund a training, retention, and professional development program for direct support professionals who serve adults with autism and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, The program will address both the need for high-quality training programs for direct support professionals serving adults with autism and the need to retain these workers at a higher rate in response to the growing numbers of adults with autism who need support services; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, The program would become the template for training and retaining direct support professionals across the Developmental Disabilities Administration service system who support adults with autism, preparing the workforce to meet the increased demand for autism services; now, therefore,

27	September 30, 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
28	shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
