CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Dorchester County – Bay Restoration Fee – Lien Against Property**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing in Dorchester County that an unpaid Bay Restoration
4 Fee is a lien against the property on which the wastewater facility, onsite
5 sewage disposal system, or holding tank is located; requiring a notice of lien to
6 be recorded in the land records of Dorchester County; and generally relating to
7 the Bay Restoration Fee.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Environment**

16 9–1605.2.

17 (d) (1) Subject to the approval of the Administration, a local government
18 or a billing authority for a water or wastewater facility may establish a program to
19 exempt from the requirements of this section a residential dwelling able to
20 demonstrate substantial financial hardship as a result of the restoration fee.

1 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph,
2 the Bay Restoration Fee shall be collected by the local government or the billing
3 authority for the water or wastewater facility, as appropriate, on behalf of the State.

4 (ii) For a wastewater facility without a billing authority, the
5 Comptroller may collect the restoration fee from the facility owner.

6 (3) A local government, billing authority for a water or wastewater
7 facility, or any other authorized collecting agency:

8 (i) May use all of its existing procedures and authority for
9 collecting a water or sewer bill, an onsite sewage disposal system bill, or a holding
10 tank bill in order to enforce the collection of the Bay Restoration Fee; and

11 (ii) Shall establish a segregated account for the deposit of funds
12 collected under this section.

13 (4) (I) **IN DORCHESTER COUNTY, AN UNPAID BAY**
14 **RESTORATION FEE SHALL BE A LIEN AGAINST THE PROPERTY ON WHICH THE**
15 **WASTEWATER FACILITY, ONSITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM, OR HOLDING TANK**
16 **IS LOCATED.**

17 (II) **A NOTICE OF LIEN SHALL BE RECORDED IN THE LAND**
18 **RECORDS OF DORCHESTER COUNTY.**

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
20 October 1, 2009.
