A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Homestead Property Tax Credit – Eligibility of Employees of the Federal Government Stationed in a Foreign Country

4 FOR the purpose of providing that a homeowner who is an employee of the federal government stationed in a foreign country may qualify for the homestead 5 6 property tax credit if the homeowner is otherwise eligible for the credit but does 7 not actually reside in a dwelling for the required time period under certain 8 circumstances; providing for the calculation of the homestead property tax 9 credit for a certain taxable year under certain circumstances; providing for the 10 application of this Act; and generally relating to the homestead property tax 11 credit.

homeowner's failure to occupy the dwelling in accordance with § 9–105 of the Tax – Property Article and the homeowner's failure to occupy the dwelling was the result of the homeowner being a federal government employee stationed in a foreign country, the homestead property tax credit for the taxable year beginning July 1, 2009, shall be calculated based on the prior year's taxable assessment of the property determined as if the homeowner had continuously qualified for the homestead property tax credit.

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 June 1, 2009, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30,
