10(2) IDENTIFY AND RECOMMEND THE FUNDING, DESIGN,11CONSTRUCTION, AND PLACEMENT OF AN APPROPRIATE MONUMENT DEDICATED12TO WOMEN FROM MARYLAND WHO SERVED IN THE UNIFORMED FORCES OF THE13UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

(G) THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A PRELIMINARY REPORT ON ITS
FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO §
2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON
OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 1, 2010.

(H) THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A FINAL REPORT ON ITS FINDINGS
 AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF
 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE
 SEPTEMBER 30, 2014.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 33 June 1, 2009. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and 4 months and, at the 34 end of September 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly,

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- 1 this Act shall be abrogated and of further force and effect. However, if a monument to
- 2 honor Maryland women in military service is completed and erected before September
- 3 30, 2014, the Commission on the Establishment of a Maryland Women in Military
- 4 Service Monument no longer needs to continue meeting after that occurrence.
