CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force - Extension and Membership Reconstitution

- FOR the purpose of extending the duration of reconstituting the Maryland Quiet 4 5 Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task Force; altering the membership of the 6 Task Force; altering the date on which the final findings and recommendations 7 of the Task Force are due; requiring the Task Force to report its final findings 8 and recommendations to the Governor; making this Act an emergency measure; 9 making a certain technical correction providing for the membership and duties of the Task Force; providing for the staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a 10 member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation; authorizing a 11 12 member of the Task Force to receive reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to report to the Governor and the General Assembly 13 14 by a certain date; making this Act an emergency measure; providing for the 15 termination of this Act; stating the intent of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the Maryland Quiet Vehicles and Pedestrian Safety Task 16 17 Force.
