 paying nonresident tuition for military personnel at public institutions of higher

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, [beginning with the 4 2004 fall semester,] a spouse or financially dependent child of an active duty member 5 who enrolls as an entering student in a public institution of higher education and is 6 exempt from paying nonresident tuition under subsection (b) of this section shall 7 continue to be exempt from paying nonresident tuition if:

- 10 (2) The spouse or financially dependent child remains continuously 11 enrolled at the public institution of higher education.
- 12 (d) The Commission shall adopt regulations in accordance with Title 10,
 13 Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article to implement the provisions of this section.
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 July 1, 2009.
