3 FOR the purpose of establishing an Overdose Prevention Pilot Program in the 4 Baltimore City Health Department; authorizing the Baltimore City Health 5 Department to issue and renew certain certificates to certain individuals, 6 conduct certain educational and training programs and written and oral 7 examinations, approve certain educational and training programs and written 8 and oral examinations, and charge certain fees; requiring certain educational 9 and training programs to include certain information; requiring applicants for a 10 certificate to meet certain qualifications and to perform certain acts; requiring 11 the Baltimore City Health Department to issue a certificate to an applicant who meets certain requirements; requiring certain information to be included on the 12 certificate; providing for the renewal and replacement of a certificate; 13 14 authorizing a certificate holder to perform certain acts; providing immunity for 15 certain persons acting under certain circumstances; providing that certain 16 provisions of this Act do not affect, and may not be construed as affecting, certain immunities or defenses; providing that this Act may not be construed to 17 create a duty to obtain a certificate; providing that an individual may not be 18 19 held civilly liable under certain circumstances; requiring the Secretary of 20 Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Baltimore City Health 21 Department, to adopt certain regulations; requiring a certain report on or before 22 a certain date and annually thereafter; defining certain terms; providing for the 23 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Overdose Prevention Pilot 24Program in the Baltimore City Health Department.
