A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Schools – Office Discipline Referrals – Accountability Policy

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education to develop a certain model 4 policy for accounting for certain office discipline referrals submitted in certain 5 schools by a certain date; requiring a certain model policy to include certain information; requiring certain county boards of education to establish certain 6 7 policies to account for certain office discipline referrals submitted in certain 8 schools; requiring certain policies established by county boards of education to 9 include certain components; requiring county boards to develop certain policies 10 in consultation with certain groups; requiring certain county board policies to include information on certain procedures; requiring county boards to submit 11 certain policies to the State Superintendent of Schools on or before a certain 12 date; defining a certain term; and generally relating to an accountability policy 13 14 by public schools for office discipline referrals.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

23 **7–311.**

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "OFFICE DISCIPLINE REFERRAL" MEANS A SCHOOL FORM THAT REFERS A STUDENT TO THE SCHOOL'S ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE TO ACT ON A DISCIPLINARY MATTER.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.





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1 (B) (1) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 31, 2010, THE STATE BOARD, AFTER 2 CONSULTATION WITH AND INPUT FROM LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEMS, SHALL 3 DEVELOP A MODEL POLICY FOR ACCOUNTING FOR ALL OFFICE DISCIPLINE 4 REFERRALS SUBMITTED IN SCHOOLS.

5 (2) THE MODEL POLICY DEVELOPED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF
6 THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE:

7(I) A STATEMENT REQUIRING ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE8PROCESS FOR REPORTING OFFICE DISCIPLINE REFERRALS IN SCHOOLS;

9 (II) MODEL PROCEDURES THAT ACCOUNT FOR AND TRACK 10 EACH OFFICE DISCIPLINE REFERRAL SUBMITTED TO THE ADMINISTRATION IN A 11 SCHOOL; AND

12(III) MODELPROCEDURESFORTHEPROMPT13INVESTIGATION OF EACH OFFICE DISCIPLINE REFERRAL.

14 (C) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR
15 ACCOUNTING FOR ALL OFFICE DISCIPLINE REFERRALS SUBMITTED IN THE
16 SCHOOLS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE COUNTY BOARD.

17(2) THE POLICY SHALL INCLUDE THE COMPONENTS OF THE18MODEL POLICY SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (B)(2) OF THIS SECTION.

19(3) A COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP THE POLICY IN20CONSULTATION WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FOLLOWING GROUPS:

21 (I) PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF STUDENTS;

22 (II) SCHOOL EMPLOYEES AND ADMINISTRATORS;

23 (III) SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS;

24 (IV) STUDENTS; AND

25 (V) MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY.

(D) EACH COUNTY BOARD POLICY SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION ON
THE PROCEDURE FOR ACCOUNTING FOR EACH OFFICE DISCIPLINE REFERRAL,
INCLUDING THE NAME AND CONTACT INFORMATION FOR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE
DEPARTMENT, DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT, WHO IS FAMILIAR WITH THE
ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES IN THE APPLICABLE SCHOOL SYSTEM.

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1 (E) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL SUBMIT ITS POLICY TO THE STATE 2 SUPERINTENDENT BY JULY 1, 2010.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 July 1, 2009.
