## Family Law – Maryland Quality Ratings and Improvement System for Child Care Programs

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to establish the 5 Maryland Quality Ratings and Improvement System (QRIS); establishing certain requirements for the Maryland QRIS; clarifying the purpose of the 6 7 Maryland QRIS; requiring the Department to use existing State and federal resources to fund the Maryland QRIS; authorizing the use of certain funds for 8 9 certain purposes; requiring the Department to select an independent party to evaluate the validity and reliability of the Maryland QRIS; requiring the 10 Department to provide certain information to the public on child care programs 11 evaluated by the Maryland QRIS; requiring the Department to reduce 12 13 unannounced visits to certain child care programs under certain circumstances; authorizing the Department to adopt regulations to implement this Act; 14 requiring the Department to submit a certain report to the Governor and 15 General Assembly each year; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 16 the Maryland Quality Ratings and Improvement System for child care 17 programs. 18

24 Preamble

WHEREAS, Recent brain research confirms that the most rapid brain growth occurs in the first 5 years of life; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.



- WHEREAS, High-quality early care and education programs make a significant contribution to the development of skills required by young children to succeed in schools; and
- WHEREAS, Not all Maryland children have access to quality early care and education programs; and
- WHEREAS, Parents who purchase child care services are entitled to receive information about the quality of child care; and
- WHEREAS, The State Department of Education has oversight of all licensed and registered child care programs; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland has numerous systems that support early care and education programs, including the Early Childhood Accreditation Program, the Maryland Child Care Credential Program, and the Tiered Reimbursement Program; and
- WHEREAS, Seventeen states have established a Quality Ratings and Improvement System (QRIS) to identify the level of quality among licensed and registered child care providers; now, therefore,
- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 (2) "EARLY CHILDHOOD ACCREDITATION PROGRAM" MEANS A

- 26 (3) "LEVELS OF QUALITY" MEANS AWARDS GIVEN TO A LICENSED
  27 OR REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE PROGRAM THAT HAS MET QUALITY CRITERIA

- 1 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE MARYLAND QRIS IS TO PROMOTE SCHOOL
  2 READINESS BY ESTABLISHING A SYSTEM TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF ALL
  3 LICENSED AND REGISTERED CHILD CARE PROVIDERS IN THE STATE.
- 4 (D) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE EXISTING STATE AND 5 FEDERAL RESOURCES TO ESTABLISH A PILOT PROGRAM AND TO IMPLEMENT A 6 STATEWIDE EXPANSION OF THE MARYLAND QRIS.
- 7 (2) FUNDS THAT ARE USED FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 8 MARYLAND QRIS MAY BE USED TO:
- 9 (I) IMPROVE THE COMPLIANCE RATES OF CHILD CARE 10 FACILITIES;
- 11 (II) ESTABLISH A METHODOLOGY TO EVALUATE QUALITY 12 LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS;
- 13 (III) EXPAND THE NUMBER OF CHILD CARE PROGRAMS
  14 OBTAINING STATE OR NATIONAL PROGRAM ACCREDITATION;
- 15 (IV) EXPAND THE NUMBER OF CHILD CARE PROVIDERS 16 RECEIVING QUALITY PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT, INCLUDING 17 POSTSECONDARY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION; AND
- 18 (V) EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS, INCLUDING VALIDITY 19 AND RELIABILITY, OF THE MARYLAND QRIS.
- 20 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT AN INDEPENDENT PARTY TO 21 EVALUATE THE VALIDITY AND RELIABILITY OF THE MARYLAND QRIS.
- 22 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC 23 ON THE EVALUATION AND RATING OF ALL LICENSED AND REGISTERED CHILD 24 CARE PROGRAMS WITHIN THE MARYLAND QRIS.
- 25 (G) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REDUCE THE NUMBER OF UNANNOUNCED
  26 MONITORING VISITS FROM ONE VISIT ANNUALLY TO ONE VISIT EVERY 2 YEARS
  27 TO ANY LICENSED CHILD CARE CENTER OR REGISTERED FAMILY DAY CARE
  28 THAT HAS REACHED, AT A MINIMUM, LEVEL 3 OF THE 5-LEVEL MARYLAND
  29 QRIS.
- 30 (H) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE 31 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

- 1 (I) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PROGRESS OF THE MARYLAND QRIS.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 2009.
