12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Environment

- 16 (a) The Department, jointly with the Critical Area Commission for the 17 Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays, shall:
- 18 (1) Review existing regulations applicable to the construction of piers
 19 and bulkheads in the tidal wetlands of the State and in the Chesapeake Bay Critical
 20 Area; and
- (2) By regulation, develop a procedure to avoid duplication of
 regulatory jurisdiction by the State and local jurisdictions concerning the construction
 of piers and bulkheads in the tidal wetlands of the State and in the Chesapeake Bay
 Critical Area.

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1 The procedure that the Department and Commission develop under (b) $\mathbf{2}$ subsection (a) of this section shall include provision for recognition of: 3 (1)State jurisdiction over the construction of piers and bulkheads in State and private wetlands designated under this title; and 4 Local jurisdiction over: $\mathbf{5}$ (2)6 (i) The construction of piers and bulkheads landward of the $\mathbf{7}$ boundary lines of State and private wetlands as mapped under this title; and 8 (ii) Zoning divisional lines and building codes. 9 **(C)** A PERSON MAY CONSTRUCT, INSTALL, OPERATE, OR MAINTAIN A 10 FLOATING VESSEL PLATFORM WITHOUT HAVING TO OBTAIN A LICENSE FROM 11 THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OR A PERMIT FROM THE DEPARTMENT IF THE 12FLOATING VESSEL PLATFORM: 13 (1) FLOATS AT ALL TIMES IN THE WATER FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE 14 OF SUPPORTING A VESSEL SO THAT THE VESSEL IS OUT OF THE WATER WHEN 15NOT IN USE; 16 (2) DOES NOT EXCEED 500 SQUARE FEET AND IS ATTACHED TO A 17DOCK, PIER, BULKHEAD, OR PARCEL OF LAND; 18 IS NOT USED FOR MOORING A VESSEL THAT REMAINS IN THE (3) 19 WATER WHEN NOT IN USE; 20(4) DOES NOT SUBSTANTIALLY IMPEDE THE FLOW OF WATER, 21CREATE A NAVIGATIONAL HAZARD, OR UNREASONABLY INFRINGE ON THE 22**RIPARIAN RIGHTS OF ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS; AND** 23IS CONSTRUCTED, INSTALLED, OPERATED, AND MAINTAINED (5) IN A MANNER THAT MINIMIZES ADVERSE IMPACTS TO SUBMERGED LANDS, $\mathbf{24}$ 25WETLANDS, SHELLFISH AREAS, AQUATIC PLANT AND ANIMAL SPECIES, AND 26 **OTHER BIOLOGICAL COMMUNITIES.** $\mathbf{27}$ SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
