1 AN ACT concerning

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Calvert County - Alcoholic Beverages

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain alcoholic beverages license fees in Calvert County; 4 creating a special beer, wine, and spirits tasting (BWST) license in the county; providing for annual fees, application procedures, and certain requirements for 5 6 the license; specifying certain conditions under which a protest to a renewal of 7 an alcoholic beverages license in the county may occur; altering the time during 8 which a penalty may be imposed for late renewal of an alcoholic beverages 9 license in the county; imposing certain fines for the sale of alcoholic beverages to 10 an underage individual in the county; altering the salaries for the chairman, 11 members, and alternate member of the Calvert County Board of License Commissioners; providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or 12 compensation of the incumbent chairman, members, and alternate member of 13 14 the Calvert County Board of License Commissioners; making certain stylistic 15 changes; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Calvert County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 6 7 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 8 3-401. 9 (a) (1) A Class D beer license shall be issued by the license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The holder of the 10 license may keep for sale and sell beer at retail at the place described in the license. 11 The beer may be consumed on the premises or elsewhere, but a license may not be 12 13 issued for any drugstore. 14 The annual fee for the license shall be paid to the local collecting agent before any license is issued, for distribution as provided. 15 16 In Calvert County the annual license fee is [\$100] **\$1,000**. (**f**) 17 5-101.18 (a) (1) A Class A beer and light wine license shall be issued by the license 19 issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The holder of the license may keep for sale and sell beer and light wines at retail, in any quantity to 20 21any consumers, at the place described in the license. The holder shall deliver the beer 22 and light wines in a sealed package or container, which package or container may not be opened nor its contents consumed on the premises where sold. 23 24 (2)The annual fee for the license shall be paid to the local collecting 25 agent before any license is issued, for distribution as provided. 26 In Calvert County the annual license fee is [\$150] **\$300**. (f) 27 5-201.28 A Class B beer and light wine license shall be issued by the license (a) 29 issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The holder may keep for sale and sell beer and light wines at retail at any hotel or restaurant, at 30 31 the place described in the license, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere. In Calvert County the annual license fee is \$250. 32 (f)

A Class A beer, wine and liquor license shall be issued by the 1 (a) (1) 2 license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The 3 license authorizes the holder to keep for sale and to sell all alcoholic beverages at retail, in any quantity, at the place described in the license. The licensee shall deliver 4 5 the alcoholic beverages in a sealed package or container and the package or container 6 may not be opened nor its contents consumed on the premises where sold. 7 In Calvert County the annual license fee is [\$500] **\$1.000**. (f) 6-201.8 9 (a) A Class B beer, wine and liquor license shall be issued by the 10 license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located, and the license authorizes its holder to keep for sale and sell all alcoholic beverages at 11 12 retail at any hotel or restaurant at the place described, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere, or as provided in this section. 13 (f) 14 (1) This subsection applies only in Calvert County. 15 (2)The annual fee for a Class B license is [\$1,000]: 16 \$1,250, IF THE PLACE OF BUSINESS REMAINS OPEN (I)17 **UNTIL MIDNIGHT; OR** 18 (II) \$2,250, IF THE PLACE OF BUSINESS REMAINS OPEN 19 UNTIL 2 A.M. 20 (3)(i) There is a Class BR beer, wine and liquor license which authorizes licensees to sell beer, wine, and liquor in restaurants for on-sale 21consumption with meals only. 22 23The annual license fee for each license is \$500. (ii) 24 (iii) Hours and days for sale are those for other Calvert County 25 Class B licensees. 26 (4)In the 27th Legislative District of Calvert County, there is a Class BLX license for luxury-type restaurants. 27 28(ii) The Class BLX license shall be applied for in the same 29 manner as are other classes of licenses. 30 (iii) The license fee is \$2,400.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 35 of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary or compensation of the chairman, members, and alternate member of the Calvert County Board of License Commissioners in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the chairman, members, and alternate member of the Calvert County Board of License Commissioners shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
