## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

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## **Boiler and Pressure Vessel Safety - Inspections**

FOR the purpose of altering the boiler and pressure vessel safety law relating to applicants for a special inspector commission by repealing certain eligibility 4 requirements; authorizing, instead of requiring, the Board of Boiler Rules to give examinations to applicants for special inspector commissions; providing that the Chief Boiler Inspector or a deputy boiler inspector shall have free access under certain circumstances to any premises in the State to investigate the activities of a special inspector; requiring the Chief Boiler Inspector or a 10 deputy boiler inspector to make certain inspections with respect to the installation, repair, or alteration of boilers and pressure vessels, to respond to and investigate certain complaints, to inspect or investigate accidents or 13 explosions involving boilers and pressure vessels, and to monitor special inspector inspections; authorizing the Chief Boiler Inspector or a deputy boiler inspector to make certain inspections involving antique and model steam boilers 15 and pressure vessels; requiring boiler and pressure vessels to be tested and maintained in a safe operating condition in accordance with certain regulations: altering provisions of law so as to give the Commissioner of Labor and Industry 18 jurisdiction jointly with the Board of Boiler Rules over the interpretation and 19 application of certain boiler and pressure vessel inspection requirements; 21 repealing certain inspection fees; adding certain inspection fees; and generally 22 relating to boiler and pressure vessel safety.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
