Dental Hygienists - Expanded Functions

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice dental hygiene"; authorizing the 3 State Board of Dental Examiners to adopt certain regulations; altering the 4 5 authority of the Board to adopt certain rules and regulations concerning the administration of certain anesthesia by certain dental hygienists; authorizing 6 7 certain dental hygienists to administer certain anesthesia under certain circumstances; requiring certain dental hygienists to meet certain educational 8 9 and examination requirements before performing certain functions; altering a 10 certain calculation of the number of unsupervised clinical hours worked by supervised dental hygienists under certain circumstances; and generally 11 relating to the practice of dental hygiene. 12

- 1 including a statement that the dental hygienist may provide dental hygiene services $\mathbf{2}$ without the supervising dentist on the premises. 3 A dental hygienist may perform authorized dental hygiene services (4) 4 without the supervising dentist on the premises only if: After the supervising dentist examines and evaluates a 5 patient, the prescribed and authorized treatment to be provided by the dental 6 hygienist is written in the patient's records: 7 8 (ii) 1. Treatments authorized by a supervising dentist to be 9 provided by the dental hygienist are rendered no later than 7 months from the date 10 the patient was examined and evaluated by the supervising dentist; and 2. Upon expiration of a prescription or prescribed 11 12 treatment, the supervising dentist examines and reevaluates the patient before 13 writing a new prescription and authorization for treatment; 14 Prior to an appointment, the patient or the custodial parent (iii) or legal guardian of a minor or incompetent adult shall: 15 Be informed that a dental hygienist will be providing 16 1. 17 services previously prescribed by a dentist who will not be on the premises during the 18 appointment; and Consent to receiving the dental hygiene services; 19 2. 20 Written emergency procedures are in place and the dental hygienist is trained to implement the emergency procedures; 2122 A designated licensed dentist is available for consultation (v) with the dental hygienist; and 2324The number of unsupervised clinical hours worked by a 25supervised dental hygienist in any given [calendar week] **3-MONTH PERIOD** is less 26than 60 percent of the dental hygienist's total hours WORKED DURING THAT 27 3-MONTH PERIOD.
