CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Building Performance Standards – Energy Conservation and Efficiency

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Housing and Community 4 Development to adopt the International Energy Conservation Code as part of 5 6 the Maryland Building Performance Standards; altering the time at which the 7 Department is required to adopt each subsequent version of the Standards; 8 requiring the Department of Housing and Community Development to consider certain changes to the International Building Code before adopting each new 9 version into the Standards; authorizing the Department to adopt certain 10 modifications of the building code as part of the Standards; prohibiting the 11 Department from adopting certain other modifications of the building code as 12 part of the Standards; requiring any version of the Standards adopted after a 13 certain dates date to include certain additional energy savings in new buildings; 14 prohibiting local jurisdictions from adopting certain local amendments to the 15 Standards; requiring local jurisdictions to implement and enforce a certain 16 version of the Standards by a certain date; and generally relating to energy 17 efficiency requirements under the Maryland Building Performance Standards. 18

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 12 (2) "International Building Code" does not include interim 13 amendments or subsequent printings of the most recent edition of the International 14 Building Code.
- 15 (e) (1) "International Energy Conservation Code" means 16 The first printing of the most recent edition of the International 17 Energy Conservation Code issued by the International Code 18 Council.
- 19 (2) "INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE" DOES NOT 20 INCLUDE INTERIM AMENDMENTS OR SUBSEQUENT PRINTINGS OF THE MOST 21 RECENT EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE.
- 22 **(F)** "Local jurisdiction" means the county or municipal corporation that is responsible for implementation and enforcement of the Standards under this subtitle.
- [(f)] (G) "Standards" means the Maryland Building Performance Standards.
- [(g)] **(H)** "Structure" has the meaning stated in the International Building Code.

- 29 (a) (1) The Department shall adopt by regulation, as the Maryland 30 Building Performance Standards, the International Building Code, INCLUDING THE 31 INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE, with the modifications
- 32 incorporated by the Department under subsection (b) of this section.

5 6	(i) review the International Building Code to determine whether modifications should be incorporated in the Standards;
7 8	(II) CONSIDER CHANGES TO THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE TO ENHANCE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND EFFICIENCY;
9	[(ii)] (III) accept written comments;
10	[(iii)] (IV) consider any comments received; and
11	[(iv)] (V) hold a public hearing on each proposed modification.
12 13 14 15	(2) (I) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE Department may not adopt, as part of the Standards, a modification of a building code requirement that is more stringent than the requirement in the International Building Code.
16 17 18 19 20 21	(II) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT ENERGY SAVINGS CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE MORE STRINGENT THAN THE REQUIREMENTS IN THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE, BUT MAY NOT ADOPT ENERGY SAVINGS CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE LESS STRINGENT THAT THAN THE REQUIREMENTS IN THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE.
22 23 24 25 26 27	(C) (1) ANY VERSION OF THE STANDARDS ADOPTED AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2012, SHALL INCLUDE ENERGY CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS THAT ACHIEVE ADDITIONAL ENERGY SAVINGS IN NEW BUILDINGS THAT ARE AT LEAST 30% GREATER THAN THE SAVINGS ACHIEVED BY COMPARABLE BUILDINGS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE 2006 VERSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE.
28 29 30 31 32	(2) ANY VERSION OF THE STANDARDS ADOPTED AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2018, SHALL INCLUDE ENERGY CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS THAT ACHIEVE ADDITIONAL ENERGY SAVINGS IN NEW BUILDINGS THAT ARE AT LEAST 50% GREATER THAN THE SAVINGS ACHIEVED BY COMPARABLE BUILDINGS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE 2006 VERSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE.

12 13 14	(a) (1) (I) Each local jurisdiction shall implement and enforce the MOST CURRENT VERSION OF THE Standards and any local amendments to the Standards.
15 16 17 18	(II) ANY MODIFICATION OF THE STANDARDS ADOPTED BY THE STATE AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2009, SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED AND ENFORCED BY A LOCAL JURISDICTION NO LATER THAN 90 120 DAYS AFTER THE MODIFICATIONS ARE ADOPTED BY THE STATE.
