- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Social Work Examiners to notify 4 applicants for licensure whether the applicants have been approved to take a 5 certain examination within a certain time period; altering certain requirements 6 for a waiver of examination requirements for certain applicants who are 7 licensed or registered to practice social work in other states requiring the Board 8 of Social Work Examiners to establish a workgroup consisting of a certain 9 membership to examine certain issues affecting the status of the workforce and 10 submit a report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the licensure of social workers. 11
